




Doug Beall Mechanical Engineering

I'm looking forward to leading the Twelfth Man in yells once again and the Aggies to another Cotton Bowl.




Kevin Buchanan Economics

HOWDY! My name is David


Mendoza, but friends call me "Diamond Dave." I am a junior computer science major from Beaumont, Texas, and I'm running for senior yell leader.
