

Vote on bilingual education held up by spending doubts

WASHINGTON (AP) — Differ-ences over how to spend an extra Steve Bartlett, R-Dallas, olls for \$100 million in federal funds to improve bilingual education in U.S. public schools kept House subcom-mittee members from voting on the funding increase Wednesday.

Instead of acting, the members deferred voting on the Bilingual Ed-ucation and Labor Act of 1987 until it comes before the full Education and Labor Committee later this month. A similar bill is making its way through the Senate.

The reauthorization bill, which will be folded into an omnibus pri-mary and secondary refunding bill, calls for increasing spending in bilingual education from \$143 million to \$246 million in fiscal 1988.


Both Republicans and Democrats agree that more money should be spent to teach students who are not proficient in English, but they differed over how the money should be

continuing current bilingual education programs but easing the limits programs. Under current law, only 4 percent

of the money allocated to bilingual education programs can fund teaching methods other than transitional bilingual education, in which sudents are taught to a certain extent in their native languages.

Bartlett's measure would increase that to 25 percent, a compromise with the Education Department, which supports 100 percent freedom for schools with bilingual edu-

Several Democrats expressed fear that more flexible spending rules would invite a return to programs in which students are required to learn all subjects in English despite language handicaps.
