



Shortage of workers for hazardous spills leads to training of police, firefighters

Funds soon will be available to make up for a shortage of trained emergency personnel to respond when hazardous materials are spilled, a Texas Engineering Extension Service administrator said.

Albert Stirling, head of the TEES oil and hazardous materials training division, said money will be available in September to train police officers and firefighters who are not already

"In this state, there are something


like 17,000 firefighters, and out of that, 14,000 are volunteers," Stirling said. "Lots of them are very qualified, but lots of them have no place to get the training. In the big cities, we are in good shape. But, in small towns, their (firefighters') basic desire is to protect their neighbor's house from burning down and now we throw a whole new world at
