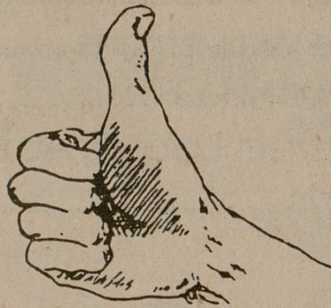

Texas grain finds storage in big baggie

AMARILLO (AP) — Great Plains Grain Terminal "Ziplocks" 2.3 million bushels of wheat into an Australian storage system, allowing it to increase its grain capacity at a reduced rate.

Chris Hyndman, manager of Great Plains, described the system as a Ziplock baggie for grain. Only this baggie is made from 220 concrete bunkers 10 feet by 4 feet, he said.

The idea is new to Texas, Hyndman said. It originated in Australia when a businessman-farmer developed the PVC bunker storage system.

The use of PVC-coated fabric panels for grain storage grew out of their use for control of water evaporation and seepage. By using a gas impermeable membrane, the known benefits of a practical gas-tight environment could be adapted for storing grain, he said.

Hyndman said the first PVC storage bunkers were erected in New South Wales, Australia, in 1977 and have since been used primarily in the Corn Belt of the United States.

"The big advantage of these bunkers is you can build it, fill it and empty it and still cover your costs in a year's time," he said.

And, the concrete will be there forever for future storage.

'Theta 5K-Run' to help Phoebe's Home

Phoebe's Home, a Christian-based shelter for abused women and their children, is the true finish line for the annual "Theta-5K Run," sponsored by the Texas A&M chapter of Kappa Alpha Theta sorority.

The 3.1-mile run starts at 9 a.m. Saturday, and the entry fee is \$8. Registration will be at the Kappa Alpha Theta house Friday from 4 p.m.-8 p.m. and on Saturday from 7 a.m.-8:30 a.m. T-shirts will be given to the first 150 people who enter.

The sorority will donate two-thirds of the proceeds from the run to Phoebe's home, which, as a branch of Twin City Mission Inc., strives to provide professional counseling, medical attention, legal aid, child care, job and education assistance, food, clothing and emergency support.

The other third of the proceeds will go to Kappa Alpha Theta's national philanthropy, the Institute of Logopedics in Chita, Kan.

Five age groups will be represented at the race in both male and female divisions: runners ages 19 and under, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, and 50 and over.

Overall male and female winners will be recognized in all age groups.

Kris Johnson, Kappa Alpha Theta service chairman, says she hopes Phoebe's Home will gain some publicity out of the run.

"I hope that people will realize that it is not shameful to stay at a shelter like Phoebe's Home," said Johnson. "Many women share the same problem, even upper-middle class women who are afraid to get help because their husbands are not respected in the community."

Dr. Wes Wallace, founder and chairman of the Austin, Texas, chapter of Physicians for Social Responsibility, will speak on the Chernobyl nuclear disaster as seen through the eyes of a physician at 7:30 p.m. Friday at the College Station Community Center.

In June 1986, Wallace and six other members of PSR were invited to the Soviet Union by the Soviet Physicians Committee for the Prevention of Nuclear War.

The physicians lectured on medical and peace issues and were allowed to interview victims of the Chernobyl disaster.

Since returning from the Soviet Union, Wallace has lectured throughout the United States and has appeared on local and national television programs.

Admission is free, and the event, presented by Brazos Valley Peace Action and Student Peace Action, is open to the public.

Doctor to speak on Chernobyl disaster

Shortage of workers for hazardous spills leads to training of police, firefighters

Funds soon will be available to make up for a shortage of trained emergency personnel to respond when hazardous materials are spilled, a Texas Engineering Extension Service administrator said.

Albert Stirling, head of the TEES oil and hazardous materials training division, said money will be available in September to train police officers and firefighters who are not already trained.

"In this state, there are something

like 17,000 firefighters, and out of that, 14,000 are volunteers," Stirling said. "Lots of them are very qualified, but lots of them have no place to get the training. In the big cities, we are in good shape. But, in small towns, their (firefighters') basic desire is to protect their neighbor's house from burning down and now we throw a whole new world at them."

Regulations passed by the Department of Labor in December require that emergency personnel and workers at hazardous material sites be trained, Stirling said. Policemen and

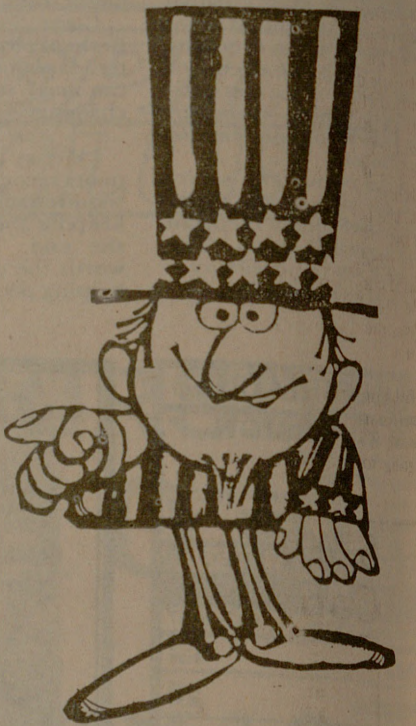
firemen also will be trained over the year.

Regulations require that a person responding to spills must have a minimum training, he said. Everyone under the new regulations was supposed to be trained by March 17, but lack of funding prevented this, Stirling said. The Department of Labor is providing \$50 million for a five-year period to train persons
