to the public, such as the texts of the student athletic handbook, the A&M staff manual and the University regulations manual

In addition, 18 pages on the policies of Cain Hall, the athletic dormitory, are included. Six of those pages are diagrams of Cain Hall's fire evacuation routes.

The in-house investigation was handled by two former A&M students — Arno W. Krebs Jr. and Otway B. Denny Jr. Both are members of the Houston law firm Fulbright & Jaworski.

University officials had little to say about the report.

Jackie Sherrill, head football coach and athletic director, declined comment when asked about it as he watched his team practice Thursday at Kyle Field.

John Keith, A&M sports information director, said, "When told it would be released, Jackie said he hasn't seen the report, he can't comment on what he hasn't seen and he's not really concerned about it right now."

On Wednesday, Jeff Alford, associate director of A&M's Office of Public Information, said the University's position was to release the report "and let everyone draw their own conclusions."

Vandiver's 119-word written statement, in addition to citing the reason for the deletions, said A&M "will cooperate with the NCAA in any inquiry of Texas A&M University athletics."

But both Keith and Lane Stephenson, director of the Office of Public Information, reiterated that A&M has never been notified that any NCAA investigation is going on.

"Before you're under investigation the president gets a letter from the NCAA," Keith said. "But we haven't received a letter."

At least one player said he hoped the release of the report would end the controversy surrounding the football program.

"I think maybe once this report gets out — and the media sees it and finds nothing in it — maybe everybody will be off us," quarterback Craig Stump said.

Regardless, Stump said, the report doesn't worry his teammates.

"You can't let it get to you," he said. "It's something that you have no control over as a player. We really don't worry about it."

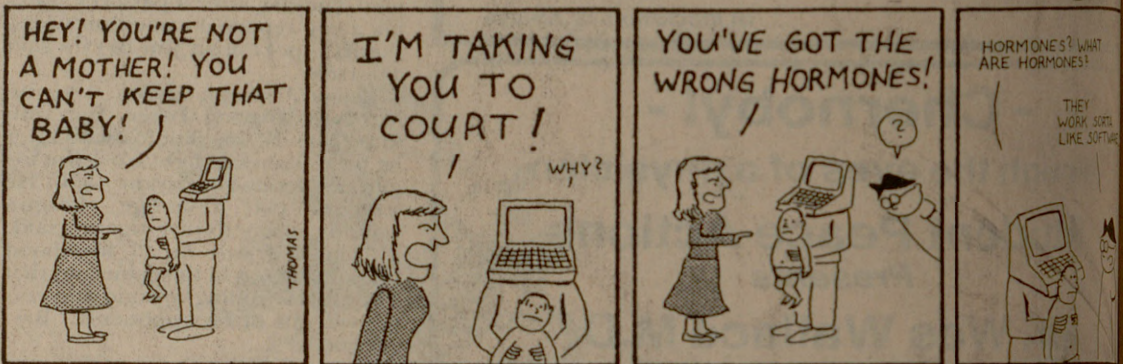

## Hobby unveils 'Build Texas' construction proposal

AUSTIN (AP) — Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby on Thursday unveiled a plan for a \$1.1 billion "Build Texas" public works program that would use long-term bonds to help construct prisons, parks and water projects.

Saralee Tiede, Hobby's press secretary, said the three proposed constitutional amendments were introduced in the Senate to authorize sales of the general obligation bonds.

Under the plan, \$300 million in proceeds would go for prisons and mental health facilities, \$400 million for local public works projects and \$400 million for water, water quality and flood control projects.

The \$300 million in bond sale proceeds for state facilities would be spent for construction projects of the Texas Department of Corrections; the Texas Youth Council,

which operates juvenile facilities and the Department of Health and Mental Retardation.

In an interview with The Post, Hobby said the program which he intends to present to the Senate State Affairs Committee Monday — would create jobs and boost the state economy while pushing work around the state.

Psychology Clinic, staffed by the psychology department. However, charge a minimal fee.

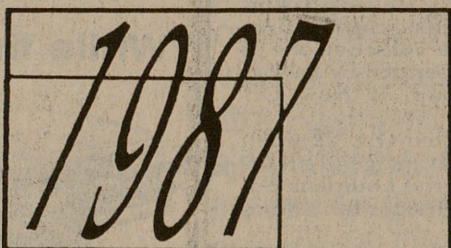
Counseling services also include answering machine with updating information on emergency counseling services.
