## Bentsen: Nuclear waste site probably won't be in Texas

### Senator says Nevada now top candidate

AMARILLO (AP) — The search for the nation's first high-level nuclear waste dump site could focus on Nevada, rather than the two other proposed locations in Texas and Washington, U.S. Sen. Lloyd Bentsen said Tuesday.

Bentsen was in Amarillo to speak at a chamber of commerce function. A subcommittee of the House Science and Technology Committee has recommended barring the Department of Energy from spending any money on site characterization in Texas or Washington.

A spokesman for Bentsen's office said the Energy Research Subcommittee, chaired by U.S. Rep. Marilyn

Loyd, D-Tenn., voted Mar. 25 to cut the DOE's request from \$500 million to \$288 million.

The subcommittee decided to bar spending in the two states after hearing testimony from a geologist who said groundwater problems could make the Texas and Washington sites impractical.

The full committee is expected to act on the legislation within the next few weeks.

Bentsen said site-testing in Deaf Smith County and on the Hanford Reservation in Washington would be an expensive process. Cutting the testing would reduce spending by about two-thirds, he said.

He said it appears that Nevada, Yucca Mountain is increasing as most acceptable site.

However, Bentsen advised Amarillo entrepreneurs against trying to develop the area around the Deaf Smith County site.

"People who are trying to do are foolhardy," he said.

Bentsen said the Nevada site has several advantages over the Texas site. For instance, shafts to the underground dump site would have to go through aquifers that would saturate the area with water, the land on the site isn't agriculturally productive and the government already owns the land.

## Clements: Parental consent important in abortion issue

AUSTIN (AP) — Gov. Bill Clements said Tuesday he considers it vital that legislation being considered to regulate abortions include a provision that unmarried teen-agers obtain at least one parent's consent for the operation.

"I think parental consent is the most important part of the bill," Clements said.

On Monday, the Senate sponsor of the abortion regulation bill said he agreed to drop the parental consent provision in hopes of obtaining more support for the measure.

"I still consider this of immense public interest, but I'm a political realist," Sen. Ted Lyon, D-Mesquite said before the Senate Health and Human Services Committee. "With that provision, I didn't have a chance to pass this bill out of this committee."

But Clements told his weekly news conference Tuesday that he expects an amendment to be offered on the Senate floor to again require a parent's consent.

"The only way to get it out of committee was to drop (the provision)," Clements said.

"I am sure that when the bill is reported out of committee and goes to the (Senate) floor, there will be an amendment that will be voted on" to again require parental consent, Clements said.

Richard Land, the governor's administrative assistant for family issues, said statistics from states that have laws requiring parental consent show a decline in abortion and pregnancy rates among teen-age girls.

"When teen-age girls in the 15-17 group, for instance, discover that they are going to have to get their parent's consent or go before a district judge or their best friend go before a district judge to get permission to have an abortion, they don't get pregnant as much frequency," Land said.

The bill, sponsored by Lyons and Rep. Mike McCall, D-Fort Worth, would prohibit abortions at a time a physician determines that a fetus is viable, or alive outside the mother's womb. If passed and signed into law, abortions in Texas would be restricted to the first time since the U.S. Supreme Court struck down abortion bans in 1973.

## Texas Senate OKs bill to extend life of mental health department

AUSTIN (AP) — The Senate on Tuesday approved a bill to extend the life of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation despite one senator's comments that a provision in the bill could lead to "open-end" expenses for parents of patients.

The MHMR department, established in 1965 and now one of the largest state agencies with nearly 23,000 employees, operates eight state mental hospitals, 13 state schools for the retarded and other facilities and programs.

The agency would be abolished on Sept. 1 under the Texas Sunset Act unless it is continued by the Legislature. The bill approved by the Senate, which extends MHMR to 1999, was sent to the House on voice vote.

Bill sponsor Ray Farabee, D-Wichita Falls, noted that the measure deletes the current fee schedule, which Farabee said was adopted in the 1960s and is outdated.

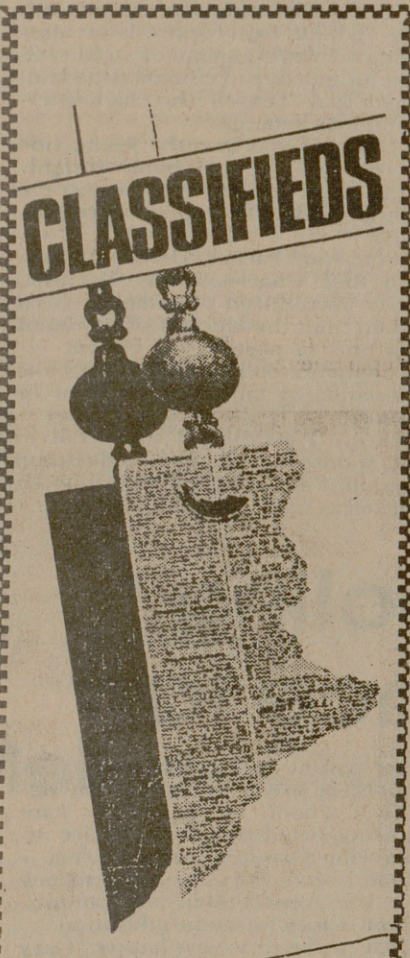
"This gives the department latitude to update the fee schedule," Farabee said.

Sen. John Leedom, D-Dallas, said the bill allows the state to raise treatment costs, which could be astronomical.

Farabee said the bill's provision would apply only to patients whose patient-children are under age 18, but could save the state millions of dollars.

Leedom's amendment to raise the fee schedule was rejected.

Farabee said the bill would meet the requirement that the state mental health commissioner be a medical doctor. However, a medical director would be added to the administrative staff.
