Texas Air official denies move to New York

HOUSTON (AP) - Some of Texas Air Corporation's top officials are planning to move from Houston to New York, the *Houston Post* reported Sunday.

Texas Air's top four corporate officers have bought homes in the New York area, industry sources told the

newspaper.
Rick Scott, spokesman for Texas Air in Houston, denied that Texas Air plans to move to New York.

He confirmed that Robert D. Sne-deker, senior vice president and treasurer, and some other officials were moving to New York.

"It makes sense to be there for what they do," Scott said, adding that Snedeker already spends a sig-nificant amount of his time in New York on company business. Chairman Frank Lorenzo placed

a bid on a home in the New York area and has enrolled his children in Connecticut schools for the upcoming year, the newspaper said.

Man grabs trooper's gun in DPS, Milw shoots companion, self in office

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — A man walked into a Department of Public Safety office Sunday, grabbed a trooper's gun, killed his female com-panion with it and then died after exchanging shots with officers, authorities said.

The man, believed to be 43 and from the Brownsville area, came into the office with a woman at about 2:45 p.m. and asked to speak to a Texas Ranger, DPS spokesman Da-vid Wells said.

While waiting in an office area, the man reached over a desk and picked up the .357 Magnum re-volver belonging to veteran trooper Earl Conaway, who was filling out reports, Wells said.

"He (Conaway) had taken off his gunbelt at some point before these people showed up and it was sitting

on the desk," Wells said.

The man then pointed the weapon at the woman's side and started to leave. "He started backing out of the sec-

tion . . . talking very rapidly in Spanish so it was difficult to understand what he was saying," Wells said.
"He got up to the door frame and then fired a shot into this woman's body," he said. "She became limp from the shot and he tried to hold

Wells said that after the man fired two more shots, a constable's office employee fired two shots at the man, who retreated into the office area.

Officers then heard another pair of shots. "One of the other troopers ran around to the outside and looked into the window and saw both peo-ple lying on the floor," Wells said.
