AUSTIN (AP) — The chairman of the House State Affairs Committee, where a resolution to form a pecial impeachment inquiry of Gov. Bill Clements has been referred, indicated Monday that there are no plans to soon consider the proposal. Rep. Pete Laney, D-Hale Center,

presided over a committee meeting that heard testimony on several bills. However, Laney cautioned the audience, "If you're here for that

purpose (the impeachment study esolution) . . . rest assured it will not

Reps. Paul Moreno, D-El Paso, and Al Edwards, D-Houston, introduced the resolution to begin a study of whether impeachment proceedings should take place in light of the latest revelations in the Southern Methodist University football scan-

A new report prepared by Methodist bishops said Clements, as former chairman of the SMU board of governors, participated in a plan to continue cash payments to football players in violation of NCAA rules

and later took part in an effort to cover up the payments.

Clements, a Republican, has branded the impeachment inquiry proposal as partisan politics. House Speaker Gib Lewis and Laney have and the action said they aren't eager to take action on the resolution, noting that SMU is a private school and Clements wasn't in public office at the time.
