## Howe reinstated in minor leagues

DALLAS (AP) — Steve Howe, the former Los Angeles Dodgers pitching star whose career was derailed by drug use, has been declared drugfree and reinstated in the minor leagues, his attorney said.

The reinstatement, which goes into effect Sunday, clears the way for Howe to sign with any major-league team, attorney John Lence said

The Texas Rangers have been most actively pursuing Howe since he returned last month from Mexico, where the one-time National League rookie of the year pitched 23 innings, allowing four hits and no runs for the Tabasco Banana Pick-

ers.

"This is the go-ahead we've been waiting for," Lence said in a telephone interview from his home in Howe would need the approval of

Baseball Commissioner Pete Ueberroth before returning to the major leagues, but that is not expected to be a problem, Lence said.

But an aide to Ueberroth said that when he was given permission to appear on a television show and failed to return to the team.

such approval would not be given immediately.

"If Steve Howe can demonstrate compliance with a drug-treatment program over a reasonable period of

time and does not show any indications of a resumption of drug use, the office of the commissioner will, with proper safeguards, allow the assignment of his contract to a majorleague team," said Ed Durso, secretary treasurer and executive vice president of the commissioner's of-

Major-league contracts must be approved by the Player Relations Committee.

Howe went through several drugtreatment programs with the Los Angeles Dodgers before being re-eased on July 3, 1985.

He later signed with Minnesota, but was released later in the season
