Physical Plant employees find new site 'comfortable'

With the beginning of construction on the long-awaited parking garage, the Physical Plant was forced to find a new home. And now, it's comfortably settled in at its new site on Agronomy Road.

The move was necessitated because the department had simply outgrown its facility. And that it happened to be an ideal place to build the 2000-car-capacity garage played a key role, Joe Estill, director of the Physical Plant, said.

"Two of the old plant's buildings would have had to be replaced because of deterioration, so the University administration felt the move was warranted," he said.

The move to the new site occurred shortly after Christmas and by the beginning of February it was business as usual for the Physical Plant Department.

The cost of the new plant to Texas A&M consisted of two types of payments.

B.F.W. Construction of Temple received about \$6 million for contracting costs and more than \$6 million went to project costs, including construction costs, architecture expenses, inspection of the site and utilities extensions, Estill said.

"The costs were expensive, but worth it, because the new site has the capacity to house more of our shops," Estill said. "There is now a warehouse to store our automobiles, which we didn't have before, and there's much more room for our 400 employees."

The new site is further from the main campus than the former plant buildings were located. But Estill said this didn't in any way hinder the department's ability to handle its duties.

"The department has a concept that utilizes four area maintenance sites on campus.

Through these shops, we can manage the day-to-day repairs and modifications that are needed.

Many of the modifications do occur and are a responsibility of the Physical Plant Department. These include building maintenance, custodial services, telecommunications, safety and health services, and transportation and utilities.

Those buildings that are used for these services are called education and general buildings and are supported by the state fund. Those that don't fall into this category are called auxiliary buildings and are privately funded. The MSC, the food service buildings and the dormitories are three of these buildings.

Although outside help is often used, Estill said most of the university's needs are met through the plant.

Deputies say man shot nephew for fear of contracting AIDS after being bitten

DENTON (AP) — A man told police he killed his nephew because he believed the nephew had infected him with the AIDS virus by biting him, officials said Tuesday.

Thomas Alexander Collins, 54, of Denton was charged with murder following Monday night's shooting of Billy Jack Collins, 38, of Dallas, Denton County Sheriff's Sgt. Larry Brearley said.


The elder Collins was in the county jail Tuesday awaiting bail review, Brearley said. The victim had been shot five times in the chest with a .38-caliber revolver at his uncle's house.

Collins surrendered to a sheriff's deputy outside his house, saying, "I shot him. I did it," according to a police report.

At the time of the shooting, the two men were arguing about the biting incident, the arrest report said.

The body was sent to Dallas for autopsy. Road blood tests on the slain man will take three to four weeks, Brearley said.

It was unknown for certain whether the victim was carrying the virus that causes AIDS, or acquired immune deficiency syndrome.
