## Israel stops production of jet fighter

JERUSALEM (AP) — The jet yielded to strong pressure from Washington and voted by the narrowest of margins Sunday to stop production of the Lavi, a new jet fighter designed as a warplane of the future.  
The vote, which followed months of acrimonious debate, was 11-10 with one abstention.  
America had provided most of the financing for the project. U.S. officials were concerned about the huge cost over-runs.  
Foreign Minister Shimon Peres said the Labor Party proposed cancellation. Absorption Minister Yitzhak Mordechai, said the Labor Party would have kept the Lavi alive, he said party leaders pressed Health Minister Shoshana Arbib to mullino to abstain rather than for continuing the project, an exp-Challe had been inclined to do.

She abstained, but wpt a vote was taken, radio sta reported.

The decision was a setback for Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir, his right-wing Likud bloc. The project was riding on the project, it was launched under a Likud ernment in 1980.

Cancellation was also a blow to Israel's billion-dollar-a-year industry, already struggling from loss of overseas markets, including South Africa and Iran, in the years.

Lavi supporters said cancellation would produce layoffs of 5,000 of the 20,000 employees of Israel Aircraft Industries, or IAI, the craft owned company that developed the plane.

About 3,000 angry workers at IAI's main factory after the announcement and blocked a main road leading to Ben Gurion International Airport. Some shouted against Peres, and workers threatened to halt commercial traffic to and from Israel.

About 50 IAI employees tested outside Shamir's office of the Cabinet meeting, shouting American slogans in Hebrew, as: "They (the Americans) care less about Israel!"  
Washington provides Israel \$1.8 billion dollars a year in aid.

## Israeli stands trial for treason in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM (AP) — Former Israeli nuclear technician Mordechai Vanunu, who told a British newspaper Israel produces nuclear weapons, went on trial behind closed doors Sunday after being brought into a courtroom with boarded windows.

Vanunu, 32, was charged with treason and espionage after the *Times* of London ran an Oct. 5 which said Israel had piled 100 nuclear weapons, was to make hydrogen and neutron bombs and ranked sixth in world nuclear powers. It based its report on information provided by Vanunu.

Israel never responded directly to the newspaper's account. It said it would not be the first country to introduce nuclear weapons into the Middle East.

Vanunu came to Jerusalem's District Court presumably in one of the blue police vans that arrived at 11 a.m. Sunday with windows painted white. A canopy was draped over the back entrance of one van to protect reporters from seeing Vanunu.

Courtroom windows were boarded up and Israel radio some court employees were temporarily for security reasons.

Vanunu faces life in prison since last October when he was brought to Israel. His family was kidnapped by Israeli agents.

Vanunu worked as a technician at the Dimona nuclear reactor in the southern Negev desert for more than nine years until he was arrested in 1986. He left Israel to travel for months lived in Australia where he converted to Christianity.

Defense attorney Avigdor Goren said Vanunu was forced to board a hood Sunday until he reached the courtroom.

The court has ordered that the trial be closed to the public, but that open proceedings would promise state security.

Feldman said the three-member panel would decide later whether on a defense motion to open the trial to the public.

Vanunu disappeared from London shortly before publication of the *Sunday Times* article. He was Meir, told the newspaper a British Israeli agent lured Vanunu to London to Rome with promises. In Rome, he said, Vanunu was drugged and abducted by agents.
