

**LX-Oakland player commits suicide**

DALLAS (AP) — Floyd Iglehart Jr., who spent three seasons in the National Football League, touched the lives of many student athletes as a high school coach and administrator, according to friends who were shocked by his suicide.

The former Los Angeles Rams cornerback and Denver Broncos team member shot himself in the head Saturday at about 8:30 p.m. The Dallas County medical examiner ruled his death a suicide.

Iglehart, an assistant football coach at Dallas South Oak Cliff High School, was in his van, parked in his driveway, when he killed himself, police said.

At the time, homicide investigators Charles Hudson and Bobby Hammer were approaching Iglehart to question him about the shooting

death of Alma Mosley, whose body was found at 2:45 a.m. Saturday at her home.

"It was a total, total shock," said Edmond Peters, head football coach at South Oak Cliff. "And under the circumstances, it is one of the most shocking things I've ever faced."

Chata Mosley, 25, one of Ms. Mosley's daughters, said Iglehart and her mother knew each other several years, but her mother recently broke off the relationship.

Homicide investigator Virgil Sparks said, "They knew he was acquainted with Mosley and they wanted to talk to him about any information he could give them about her."

Chata Mosley said she was asleep at the home when her 44-year-old mother was killed.

"All I heard were the two shots and then I saw my mother lying in the hallway," she said. "I didn't see what happened or who killed her."

Iglehart was drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in 1957 and played two years with the team. His pro career was cut short by a knee injury. Iglehart formally retired after spending his third season with Denver.

"He was never bitter about playing such a short time," said Phyllis Iglehart-Beasley, Iglehart's daughter. "He looked at it as just another event in his life. What he wanted to do after that was help as many black players make something out of their lives as they could."

Iglehart was a Lincoln High School football and track star who earned a master's degree in physical

education at Prairie View A&M, a bachelor's degree from Wiley College in Marshall. During his years at Wiley, Iglehart earned America honors as an end at the college.

He became athletic director and head football coach at Central School in Galveston in 1960. He was named offensive coordinator at South Oak Cliff in 1964.

He became Lincoln's athletic director and head coach, but in 1974 to serve as offensive coordinator at Bishop College. He was Bishop one year, then worked for six years as an offensive coordinator at Zumwalt Middle School in his fourth year as principal at South Oak Cliff.

**Lendl, Graf win; Mandlikova fined for tantrum**

NEW YORK (AP) — Top seeds Ivan Lendl and Steffi Graf advanced to the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open Monday, but No. 4 women's seed Hana Mandlikova lost after being penalized a game for smashing her racket against a scoreboard.

It was the second time in three days that a player was penalized a game for poor behavior.

In his third-round victory over Slobodan Zivojinovic Saturday, John McEnroe was punished for cursing and yelling. The following day, he was fined \$17,500 and suspended for two months pending an appeal.

Lendl, the two-time defending champion, beat No. 16 Anders Jarryd 6-2, 7-6 (7-2), 6-4, while Graf downed No. 13 and 13th-ranked Sylvia Hanika 7-5, 6-2.

Other women advancing to the quarterfinals were second-seeded Martina Navratilova, No. 6 Helena

Sukova and No. 11 Lori McNeil.

Mandlikova lost to ninth-seeded Claudia Kohde-Kilsch 6-7 (4-7), 6-4, 6-1 on an outside court at the National Tennis Center.

Mandlikova got her first warning after cursing an official who had just called a foot fault on her in the fifth game of the first set.

Her temper flared again after she lost the second game of the third set by hitting a shot wide. When she cursed at the line official, Mandlikova was given a point penalty that forced her to start the next game down 0-15.

Mandlikova lost that game to fall behind 2-1 in the set. During the changeover, the 25-year-old Czechoslovakian slammed her racket against the scoreboard, prompting head referee Georgina Clark to penalize her a game.

Kohde-Kilsch won the next three

games to close out the match.

After the match, Clark said Mandlikova would be fined \$500. Mandlikova could be fined up to \$10,000 after further review by a disciplinary committee made up of players and a representative of the Women's International Tennis Association.

Mandlikova was not immediately available for comment.

Although they both won in straight sets, Lendl and Graf had their toughest matches of the tournament.

Graf had her service broken three times, but Kohde-Kilsch couldn't overcome her fellow West German's powerful forehand.

"I knew it was going to be tough," Graf said. "She didn't make many mistakes."

Graf's next opponent is expected to be fifth-seeded Pam Shriver, who

was scheduled to play later today against unseeded Jana Novotna of Czechoslovakia. Shriver won the day with an 18-match win streak.

After Lendl broke Jarryd in the seventh game of the set, the two players held straight games before Lendl again to win final game of the set.

"I didn't like anything about except I won," Lendl said. "Moving as well and not too crisply. I was missing. It was hot and humid, and it was play."

In women's play, Navratilova No. 14 Catarina Lindqvist and Sukova downed unseeded Hobbs 6-4, 6-2; and McNeil defeated No. 7 Zina Garrison 6-3, 7-6 (8-6).
