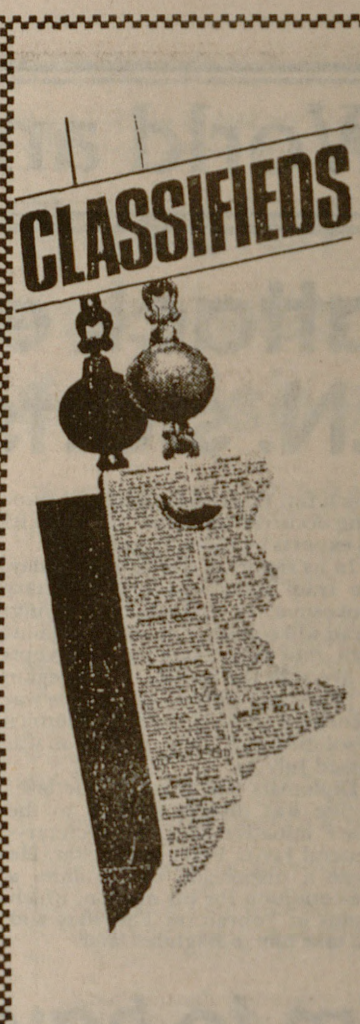

Hart to face questions in scandal

WASHINGTON (AP) — Front-runner Gary Hart Tuesday to face questioning the scandal that drove him from 1988 Democratic presidential and to address the speculation would re-enter it.
 Four months to the day after former senator from Colorado the contest for the Democratic presidential nomination, Hart was the only guest on a special one-hour edition of the ABC News "Nightline" program from Washington.
 Cable News Network quizzed named sources as saying Hart tell "Nightline" anchorman Koppel that he will not get back the race.
 Friends and former aides they expected him to apologize his actions that ended his House bid.
 It was to be Hart's first interview since the possibility of becoming a candidate again raised in August. ABC News man Laura Wessner said that "absolutely no restrictions" on questions Koppel would ask.

Hart abandoned the Democratic race May 8 in the middle of a very about his relationship Donna Rice, a Miami model. Then, he has largely stayed sight, talking with supporters giving a few, limited interviews.
 Rice has been negotiating her story for \$200,000 for a made for the ABC television work.
 But in August, Bill Dixon, former campaign manager, prompted new speculation by he expected Hart to get back race this fall.
 A national poll in July had Hart still was the choice of Democrats for the nomination any of the seven active candidates.
 Hart, vacationing in Ireland time, denied the report through aide but did not comment directly.
 A Gordon Black poll for USA Today on Tuesday said Americans on whether Hart should re-race — 42 percent said yes, 53 percent said no. The poll, based interviews with 805 adults, had a margin of 4 percentage points.

Stock market falls sharply in trading

NEW YORK (AP) — The market declined in active trading Tuesday, still smarting from increases in the Federal Reserve discount rate and major prime lending rate.
 After falling sharply for the session, Wall Street posted modest technical recovery late day, when the Dow Jones index average bounced off the psychologically important 2,500-point traders said.
 The widely-watched blue-chiprometer finished 16.26 points at 2,545.12 after having fallen much as 62 points earlier.
 Declining issues outstripped advancers by about 8-to-1 on the New York Stock Exchange, with stocks falling, 211 gaining and unchanged.
 Volume on the Big Board 242.8 million shares, up from 129.07 million in Friday session. The financial markets closed Monday for Labor Day.
 Friday's hikes in the discount and the prime rate were Tuesday in steeply escalating rates on bonds in the open market. Higher interest rates are active for stock prices, since they discourage company investment.
 The Fed raised its discount rate 6 percent from 5.5 percent to help the faltering dollar. The rate, the interest the Fed charges loans to U.S. financial institutions had not been lifted in three years.
 The Fed's move was copied major banks across the country which raised their prime rate by a half percentage point to 8.75 percent, the highest level the prime since March 1986.
 Analysts said many market observers anticipate that the Fed will the discount rate again if primary figures for July due to be published Friday show another alarming picture of the nation's deficit and force the dollar lower.
