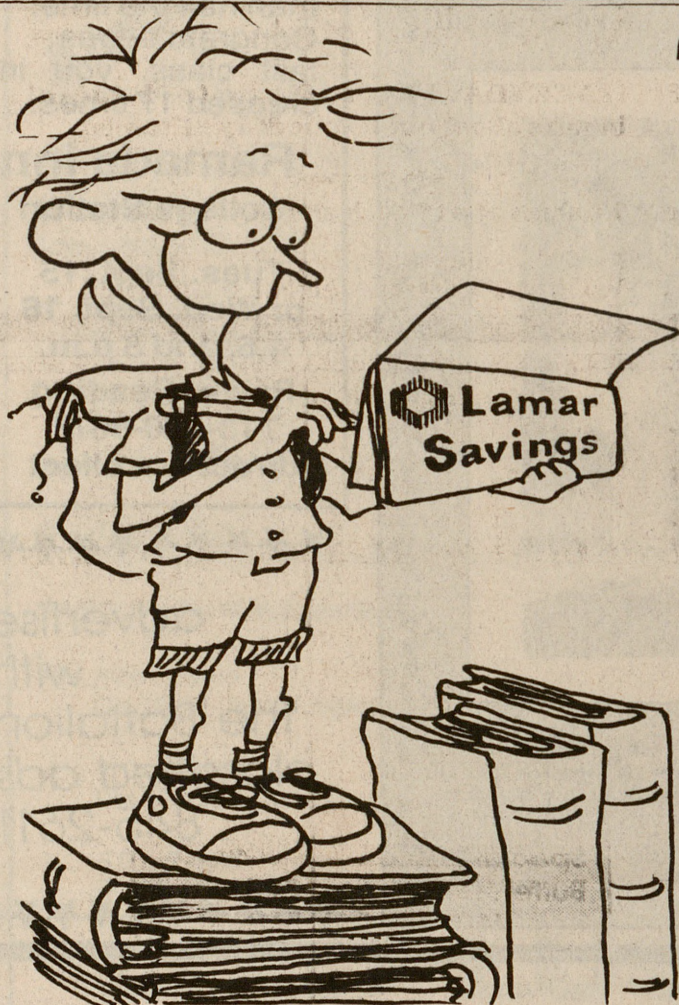

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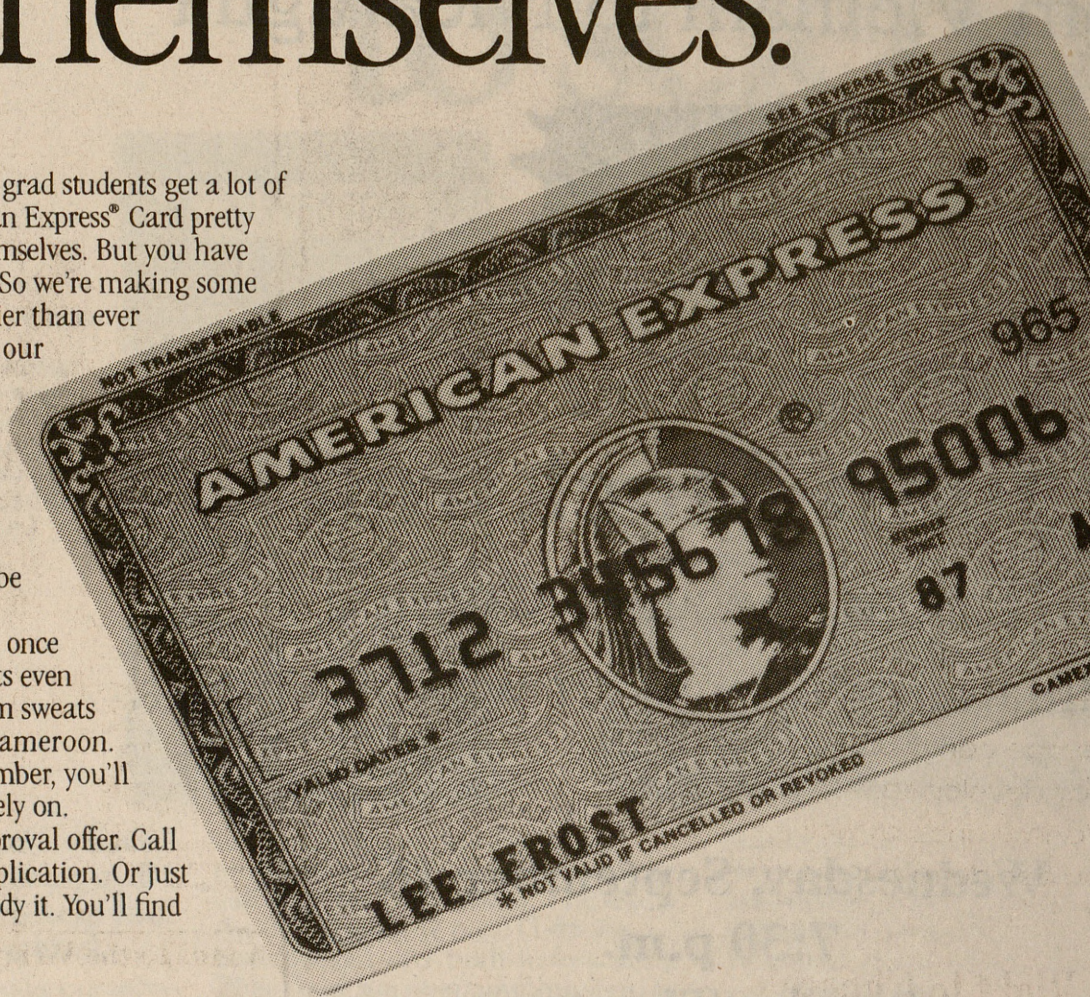
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Police Beat

- The following incidents were reported to the University Police Department from Sept. 5 through Saturday:
- MISDEMEANOR THEFT:**
 - Five bicycles were reported stolen.
 - A student told police that someone took her backpack while it was left unattended on a shelf designated for student's belongings in the Commons Dining area.
 - A purse was stolen when it was left unattended in the lounge area of the Veterinary Science Building.
 - A student reported that someone removed \$162 from his checkbook.
- UNAUTHORIZED SOLICITATION:**
 - A student reported that a man wearing a light blue shirt and white shorts attempted to sell her magazine subscriptions in her dorm room.
 - Police were told that someone was attempting to sell magazines in McFadden Hall.
