"We had our mind made up," said California Manager Gene Mauch. "Minton would get Fletcher and Buice would finish up. It didn't happen today, and it hasn't happened a


Hough committed two balks for an American League one-season record and hit three batters for a franchise

In the first, with Devon White on first, Hough committed his eighth balk of the season, tying the American League record set by Frank Tanana in 1978.

Two batters later, he hit Wally Joyner with a pitch for his 13th hit batsman of the season, tying a Rang-ers record set in 1972 by Pete Bro-Hough, a knuckleballer, then broke the record when he hit Brian Downing in the fifth and hit Joyner again in the seventh.

His balk following Downing's oneout single in the seventh set a league record and set up California's tying run when Downing scored on Johnny Ray's two-out single.

With the victory, the Rangers improve their season record to 73-76 and increased their lead over California to 4½ games. Both teams however, trail first-place Minnesota, which has a 79-70 record.
