Landa wrote that the sacrifices hearts were ripped out and their bodies tossed to the base of the temple, where they were skinned.

Priests would wear the skins and perform a dance. Landa wrote that this ceremony was a time of high sol-

He also told of instances of decapitation in Mayan culture. If the monumental structure had been a religious temple, the burial could have been sacrificial, Massey says. The skulls are important because

a cross section of the Colha population can be studied at a specific point in time, Massey says.

Some individuals had modified craniums of different styles or filed teeth and some did not, which implies that the culture either tolerated

The most important discovery about the skulls was the presence of patterned cut marks all over the head, indicating that the people were skinned, Massey says.

The cut marks are physical evidence of Landa's reports of Mayan skinnings, she says.
