

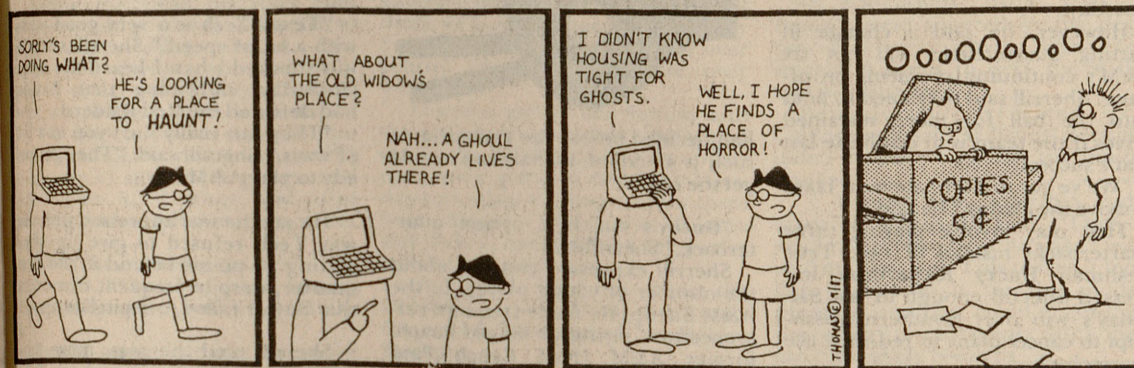

Police Beat

Religious group sues to continue Bible courses

AUSTIN (AP) — A religious group that wants to continue offering Bible courses at the University of Texas has sued the university in federal court.

The Biblical Studies Association, which has sponsored the courses through endowed chairs, asked in the lawsuit filed last week that the course arrangements be declared constitutional.

The university does not plan to offer the courses after this semester because Attorney General Jim Mattox ruled that the course arrangements violate the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.

The practice of a state university giving credit for courses in which instructors are paid by a religious group represents an "excessive entanglement" between church and state, Mattox ruled.

Mattox said the university could continue to offer the courses if they are made regular university courses with instructors selected and paid by the university.

However, university officials said they did not wish to take those steps.

Gary Thornton, an attorney representing the association, said, "Our position is that the courses were not unconstitutional to begin with. 'Still, the attorney general said the problem could be solved easily. . . . So we don't think complete cancellation of the courses is justified," he said.

The court could not force the university to continue the Bible courses, but it could clarify the issues surrounding them, Thornton said.

Houston professor studying use of smokeless tobacco among Little League players

HOUSTON (AP) — A University of Houston scientist is using a \$1.6 million grant to study Little League baseball players' use of smokeless tobacco in hopes of fighting oral cancer.

Richard Evans, a psychology professor and principal investigator for the National Cancer Institute-sponsored five-year project, estimated 10 percent of all teen-agers chew or dip tobacco. That's about the same percentage as adult usage and is up 3 to 4 percent in the past six years.

"We have a chance now to stem the tide, before this becomes established," he said.

Evans said an earlier study by the school showed 55 percent of high school or junior high school students who used the smokeless tobacco began the practice before the age of 12.

Evans said he believes usage is climbing because smokeless tobacco is more easily concealed than cigarettes.

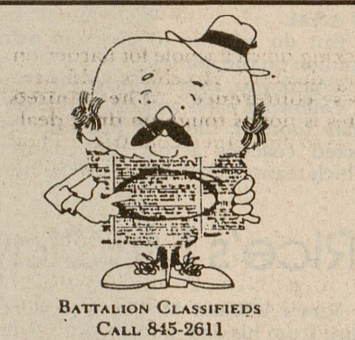
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
