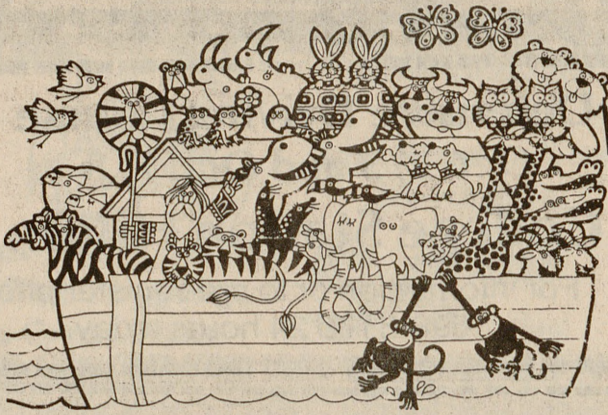

Landry cautious about new Pokes

IRVING (AP) — Dallas Coach Tom Landry said Tuesday he isn't certain if the substitute Dallas Cowboys' team he is forming could beat No. 1-ranked Oklahoma in the collegiate ranks.

"Give me a month and we might," Landry said after he was asked if his collection of free agents could handle the Sooners. "I'm not sure what level we can play because we haven't even seen our team scrimmage."

Landry said he hasn't scrimmaged his team for fear of injury. "We can't afford to scrimmage," Landry said. "We're down to five offensive linemen. We just have enough players to play. We're just trying to get 'em in shape."

The Cowboys meet the New York Jets on Sunday at 3 p.m. CDT in the Meadowlands, Dallas' first contest, since the National Football League players' strike began.

"I think we will have a good overall team, but we have no idea what we are going to come up against in the Jets," Landry said. "Defense normally has the advantage early in the season, but who really knows because we've never had a game like this," he said. "We have veterans like Randy White and Don Smerek in the defensive line, so that could be an advantage for us."

Landry said he might be inclined to try more trick plays than normal. "We might have a little more wide open approach," he said.

Landry said quarterback Kevin Sweeney, the NCAA's all-time passing leader, has been looking sharp in practice.

"He's been throwing the ball very well and it will be interesting to see how he competes against the Jets," Landry said. Landry said if veteran quarterback Danny White changes his mind and crosses the picket line, then White would start.

"Sure, Danny would be my starter," Landry said. "If anybody else crosses, we will sure use them."

Landry said the free agents and the coaches were taking the Jets seriously "because these games count in the standings. That gets your attention. I will be doing my very best to coach this team (to a victory)."

Herzeg: HSA needs more flexibility

HOUSTON (AP) — Houston Oilers General Manager Ladd Herzeg is complaining that the Astrodome's operators are doing little to convince him the National Football League team should not move to Jacksonville, Fla.

"We've exchanged five proposals with them in the last five days," he said Monday. "They made four proposals. And we gave them one proposal. Now we need to see some movement from them."

Herzeg and the Houston Sports Association, which operates the Astrodome and owns baseball's Houston Astros, are trying to get together on a new stadium lease to replace the agreement that expires at the end of the year.

"The HSA needs to get a mindset that they've got to come off the dollar-figure amount they're dealing with now," Herzeg said after rejecting HSA's latest proposal. "The HSA keeps giving us different proposals, but when I put a pencil to them, they always seem to come out the same."

The Oilers are being wooed by football-starved Jacksonville officials who are promising numerous incentives, including a \$115 million ticket-sale guarantee over 10 years.

HSA President Bob Harter would say only that Herzeg had asked for a clarification of the latest lease proposal and that his organization complied.

"Other than that, I prefer not to make any comment on any aspect of the negotiations," he said.

The Harris County Commissioners Court has approved \$50 million in improvements to the Astrodome, which is owned by the county. The improvements, however, are contingent on the Oilers remaining in the city.

"In one proposal, they may give a little on rent and take a little on parking," Herzeg said of his efforts with the HSA. "Or they may give a little on concessions and take a little on rent. But the net effect is the same. We don't get what we've asked."

"If the HSA would just be willing to give up a little of its excess profit on our games at the Astrodome, it could lead to an agreement. But I haven't seen any willingness to do that yet."

Mattingly's grand slam sets record, leads Yanks to win

NEW YORK (AP) — Don Mattingly's major league record sixth grand slam home run of the season backed the four-hit pitching of Charles Hudson to lead the New York Yankees to a 6-0 victory over the Boston Red Sox Tuesday night.

Mattingly's home run in the third inning gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead off Bruce Hurst, 15-13, and a fifth run scored on Bobby Meacham's groundout in the same inning.

Hudson, 11-6, walked one and struck out three in pitching his second shutout and fifth complete game of the season.

Mattingly broke a record set in 1955 by the Chicago Cubs' Ernie Banks and tied by the Baltimore Orioles' Jim Gentile in 1961. Mattingly's homer, his 29th, came on a 1-2 pitch off Red Sox left-hander Bruce Hurst and gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead.

With one out in the third, Roberto Kelly singled and moved to second on Rickey Henderson's single.

With Willie Randolph at bat, Kelly and Henderson worked a double steal. It was the 700th steal of Henderson's career.

Randolph then walked on a 3-2 count to lead the bases for Mattingly.

Ags climb to 15th spot in AP Top 20

From The Associated Press Oklahoma remained No. 1 for fifth straight week, but No. 2 Nebraska moved closer to its Big Eight Conference rival in the latest Associated Press college football poll.

The Sooners, who routed Texas 65-0 Saturday, received 44 of first-place votes and 1,181 of a possible 1,200 points Tuesday from a nationwide panel of sports writers and sportscasters.

Miami, Fla. became the first team in three weeks other than Oklahoma and Nebraska to get a vote for No. 1.

Florida State jumped from sixth to fourth with 965 points after defeating Michigan State 31-3.

Notre Dame shot from eighth place to fifth with 890 points following a 44-20 triumph over Purdue.

Auburn fell from third to sixth with 859 1/2 points.

LSU's 13-13 tie with Ohio State dropped the Tigers from fourth place to seventh with 821 1/2 points.

Clemson moved from ninth to eighth with 810 points following a 33-12 victory over Georgia Tech.

Ohio State skidded from seventh to ninth with 775 1/2 points and Tennessee rounded out the Top Ten with 636 1/2 points.

The Second Ten consists of UCLA, Michigan, Arizona State, Penn State, Texas A&M, Washington, Alabama, Iowa, Florida and Georgia. Alabama and Iowa finished tied for 17th.

Florida, which raised its record 3-1 by defeating Mississippi State 3, made the Top Twenty for the first time since the preseason poll.

Speier recalls prior Giants championship

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Utility infielder Chris Speier was happy but philosophical amid the locker room joy and traditional champagne celebration marking the San Francisco Giants' clinching of their first division title since 1971.

At 36, Speier is the oldest player on a relatively young San Francisco team, and he has seen the Giants come full circle.

San Francisco clinched the National League West title Monday night with a 5-4 victory over the San Diego Padres at Jack Murphy Stadium, also the site of the 1971 Giants' clinching when they beat the Padres on the final day of the season.

The 16-year major-league veteran sees many differences between the Giants' teams of 1971 and 1987.

"The other team had (Willie) Mays, (Juan) Marichal, (Willie) McCovey, (Gaylord) Perry and (Bobby) Bonds," Speier said. "They had been around and established themselves as superstars. You're talking about four or five guys who will probably be in the Hall of Fame. This club is young. They haven't established themselves as superstars, but they will."

The Giants pennant-clinching victory came on reliever Don Robinson's bases-empty homer in the eighth.

Earlier, Jeffrey Leonard hit a two-run pinch homer and Chili Davis hit a solo pinch homer. The two pinch homers tied a major league record for most in a game and were the 100th homers of Davis' and Leonard's careers.
