



Battle over Bork marks Reagan's lowest point

WASHINGTON (AP) — The likely rejection of Robert Bork as President Reagan's nominee for the Supreme Court marks the low ebb in Reagan's worst year yet on Capitol Hill, and lawmakers say the president has responded to defeats by growing even more confrontational.

The White House apparently has

concluded that, having lost control of the Senate in the 1986 elections, it is better to make a stand on principles and go down in martyrdom than to seek compromise from a weakened position.

"They are following a scorched-earth policy," Senate Majority Leader Robert Byrd, D-W.Va, said. Veto, threaten veto, vote no, filibus-

ter, stall, delay. It's a no-win policy."

The year has yielded a string of losses for the administration, growing ever more visible. The year began badly when Reagan vetoed two major spending measures, the clean water bill and a highway authoriza-
