The defense returned to form as well Saturday, limiting the Bears to just 213 total yards while recovering three fumbles and intercepting Baylor quarterback Brad Goebel once.

"In the second half A&M whipped our tails out there," Baylor Coach Grant Teaff said. "The way the game was going, I think we could have played until midnight and

Baylor only had four first downs in the seond half to go along with 82

The real Aggies finally showed up driving 66 yards on 10 plays to take a light, battering Baylor by a connecting 34-10 score.

Lewis had scored on an eight yard run, but his touchdown may not have been because of an apparent A&M fumble four plays earlier.

Lewis took a pitch-out on the Bears' 38 yard line, but dropped the ball and Baylor's Eugene Hall recovered. However, an inadvertant whistle before the fumble enabled the Aggies to retain possession.


