Syracuse crushes Nittany Lions to become the East's top team

From the Associated Press For Penn State, facing Don Mc-Pherson was like facing a loaded

gun. And the Syracuse quarterback didn't wait long to pull the trigger. Firing an 80-yard scoring pass on the first play from scrimmage, Mc-Pherson figured in four more touch-

Nittany Lions 48-21 Saturday. "When I saw the cornerback fall, I knew it was bombs away," said Mc-Pherson, who connected with Rob Moore after a Penn State defender
