Deserted baby grabs attention of Dallas public

DALLAS (AP) — Officials say an infant left for dead in a trash dumpster has emerged from the ordeal in surprisingly good shape, and Parkland Memorial Hospital is being flooded with donations and requests to adopt the city's Christmas season miracle baby.

There have been so many calls from people wanting to help that Karen Robbins of the Texas Department of Human Services decided the baby should be known by more than a generic name.

She named the child Natalie Christine, a choice inspired by the season.

"It seemed kind of sad to send donations to 'Baby Girl,'" Robbins said. "She didn't have a very good start. Maybe her luck will change with a strong name."

"Natalie" was left in a trash bin behind a south Dallas apartment complex just after birth, her placenta and umbilical cord still attached. Authorities said the infant survived, apparently because the trash which covered her helped insulate her from the cold.

"Right now she's just a normal infant — eating and sleeping," said Robbins, who was assigned to the baby's case. "She appears real healthy."


The Department of Human Services, which was granted temporary custody of Natalie, is expected to place the child with a foster family within a few days. A judge should make a final decision about the girl's custody on Wednesday.

Valencia Gill-Hooper, the hospital's adoption social worker, said, "It's just been phenomenal. A lot of people want to adopt this baby."

Authorities, meanwhile, have tried to locate Natalie's parents, but they say they have little information.

Parkland officials said many people are calling the hospital to check on the girl's condition or to ask what they can do for her. Donations are being sent in care of Betty Sloan at the Dallas County Child Welfare Board.

Aircraft flying through active electrical storms often develop corona discharge from antennas, propellers and the wing structure. It also is seen from the masts of ships at sea. The name St. Elmo's Fire was given to the phenomenon by early Mediterranean sailors who regarded it as a visit from their patron saint, Elmo.

Teacher gets two-year term for sexually assaulting boys

BROWNSVILLE (AP) — A former English teacher, who pleaded guilty to sexually assaulting two boys, received a two-year prison sentence Wednesday, then was arraigned on additional charges that arose during the investigation of a 14-year-old boy's death.

In addition to the prison sentence, Raymond Earl Watts, 37, was assessed a total of \$20,000 in fines.

The charges on which he was convicted were based on statements from two boys, ages 13 and 14, that Watts had oral sex with them.

"Needless to say, we are happy with the verdict (sentence)," Watts' attorney, Juan Jose Martinez, said, adding that two years was better than the 40 years the prosecution had recommended.

The jury deliberated about two hours Wednesday in deciding Watts' sentence.

He originally faced eight charges, including aggravated sexual assault

of a minor, sexual assault of a minor and indecency with a minor, before pleading guilty to two sexual assault charges.

Two hours after his sentencing, Watts, a seventh- and eighth-grade English teacher in Brownsville until his suspension last March, was arraigned on two additional felony charges of sexual assault of a minor, one felony charge of indecency with a minor and a misdemeanor weapons charge.

The new charges, filed last week, arose from an investigation by the Cameron County Sheriff's Department into the death of a 14-year-old Mexican national whose body was found near Russelltown. Sheriff Alex Perez said the victim apparently had been beaten, then set on fire.

No one has been charged in the boy's death, Perez said.

The sheriff said the three in the new sexual assault and indecency charges were friends of a boy, whose charred body was found Nov. 22 near the Cameron County community of Russelltown.

Perez said the dead boy was believed to be an acquaintance of Watts. Statements read during trial, which ended Wednesday, included allegations by boys that picked them up at Market Square downtown Brownsville, took to his apartment, engaged in acts and took nude photographs.

The sheriff recommended Wednesday that Justice of the Peace Tony Torres set high bonds for four new charges against Watts.

"In my opinion, he's dangerous to our community," Perez said.

Torres set bonds at \$152,500 on the four new charges.
