## BVSO presents Mozart, Tchaikovsky

Small winds circulate through the room. They curl up inside the ear and soothe the mind and the soul. The sounds grow and the air becomes thick with complex melodies. The notes build until they seem to explode from the instruments of the Brazos Valley Symphony Orchestra.

The orchestra will be performing the music of Tchaikovsky and Mozart in Rudder Auditorium Thursday at 8 p.m. The program will include Tchaikovsky's fifth symphony and Mozart's "Symphonia Concertante" for flute, oboe, bassoon and horn. The symphony will also perform "Overture Axur Re D'Ormus" by Antonio Salieri.

Tchaikovsky wrote his Fifth Symphony in 1888 while resting at his

country estate. It was his most ambitious undertaking since his Fourth Symphony, written eleven years earlier. He had many doubts about the quality of the work, but its enthusiastic reception by audiences and critics overcame them, and it remains a favorite of audiences today.

Wendy Dackson, executive director for the symphony, says the 60-to 70-member orchestra performs five times a year, with all volunteer membership.

Theodore Kim, a junior aerospace engineer who has played with the orchestra for seven years, says the orchestra keeps improving.

"It's been getting better every year," he said. "People are improving and we're getting better as a group."

Senior civil engineering major Melanie Sattler says that during her one and a

half years with the orchestra she has been surprised at the quality of the community orchestra. She also said the organization is good because it allows students to interact with people outside the University.

"It's a neat approach for university students to meet people in the community," she said. Sattler said she did not participate in the orchestra this semester but she enjoyed her time with it.

"I miss it a whole lot," she said.

Tickets for Thursday's performance will be on sale at the door for Texas A&M students for \$5. Graduating seniors and their guests will receive a 30 percent discount. Prior to the performance, tickets will be on sale at the MSC Box Office and are \$12 for adults, \$10 for students and senior citizens and \$8 for children.
