> The San Jacinto is named after the 1836 battle in which the outnumbered Texas Army, commanded by Sam Houston, defeated the Mexican Army under Gen. Santa Anna. The battlefield site, about 15 miles east of downtown Houston, is now a Texas state park and home to the Battleship Texas.


Flying a Texas flag on its beam mast, the new 567-foot vessel exchanged a 21-gun salute with a fourcannon battery manned by Texas National Guardsmen onshore.

The 21-gun salute, normally re-served for foreign heads of state, was designated in honor of the Battleship Texas, the flagship of the Texas Navy.

The ship, the last of the dread-naught class of battleships, saw action in World Wars I and II and now is undergoing restoration.
