"Each room now has individual heating and cooling controls," he said. "They added more wall plugs to the rooms to accommodate computers and everything else, because before there were two wall plugs in the whole room. Now there's a wall plug on every wall."

Lane said the walls were sandblasted and replastered. The bathrooms — which are still two to a floor — were completely stripped and have a new shower stall arrangement.

"In the rooms they put a whole new sink with a cabinet underneath," Lane said. "Before, they were free standing sinks."

He also said a new fire alarm system was installed. "Each room has its own smoke alarm and fire alarm in it now," he said. "Before it was just a smoke alarm and fire alarm in the hallway with a horn. Now each room has its own fire alarm system that's hooked up to the central unit."

able to get on-campus housing. In a related development, plans for a privately owned, off-campus dormitory fell through last week, so a solution from that quarter does not appear to be coming soon.

An Austin firm's Oct. 1 plan to buy the 17-story Ramada Inn of College Station and convert it into a private dormitory did not materialize.

After negotiations lasting through October, November, December and part of this month, the FDIC, which owns 53 percent of the 363-room hotel, and 13 banks, which own the rest, could not agree on terms to sell the hotel.

John Needham, an officer for Byrum Properties, said his company has no immediate plans to try to make another deal, and they are not aware of any similar plans for private dorms in College Station.

The ownership of the hotel by the Federal Deposit Insurance and 13 Gulf Coast banks is a result of the April 30 failure of United Houston.

Donald B. Powell, director of business services, said the \$22 million for construction of new dorms and an approximate million for the Commons dining facilities expansion will come from bond sale.

He said all auxiliary enterprises on campus, such as dorms and Services, must be self-supporting since they get no money from state.

The bonds sold for dorms will be paid back through rent from dormitory residents and the fee for dining facility expansion will be repaid through money from food plans and from food sold.

Peel said the expansion of Commons dining facility should be completed by December 1988.

Officials scramble to raise \$300,000 for Bishop College

DALLAS (AP) — Bishop College officials were trying to raise \$300,000 by Tuesday night's deadline to qualify for a matching grant from an anonymous donor but said they had no idea how close they were to reaching their goal.

"We are moving ahead in our efforts but we have no idea of the status of the campaign," said Dr. M. Christine Gilmore of the president's office.

The deadline was set by the anonymous donor.

The money would help the school escape its financial woes, which led the U.S. Department of Education to deny the school \$400,000 in federal financial aid last month. The department has given the school until

The next dorms to be renovated are Crocker, Moore, Davis-Garrett and Moses, Lane said.

Dan Mizer, housing operations supervisor, said work on Crocker and Moore will start in May and be finished in December. Davis-Garrett and Moses will be renovated starting in January of next year and be finished in July of next year.

Thomas said work will then be done on the remaining Corps dorms.

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
