

2-year-old's body found in shallow grave

Authorities said they were alerted the situation when the child's andfather received a telephone l in Louisiana late Sunday from daughter, who told him Andrea cole Garcia was buried near a moel where she and her boyfriend

The grandfather called police, ho went to the Bel-Air Motel on Monday and questioned the couple, homicide investigators said.

Jerry Saldana, 25, of Nixon, identified as the woman's boyfriend, was being held in the Travis County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 bond after being charged with murder, police said.

The child's mother. Anita Garcia. was not charged. She was questioned and released, police said.

Travis County Medical Examiner Dr. Robert Bayardo said an autopsy showed that the child died of two blows to the head and one to the abdomen. The girl also had numerous scrapes and bruises. The body was wrapped in several baby blankets, he

Authorities said they believe Andrea suffered the fatal beating Jan. 23, and Bayardo said she died within 24 hours. She was buried within 48 hours of her death, police said.

We do not believe the mother was involved in the fatal beating. Her involvement was brought about by her fear of the suspect, who had beaten her before. That is one reason why she did not report it," Slat-

Authorities said Garcia and Saldana had been living together for two months before the death of the little girl. She and the baby's father are divorced, they said.
