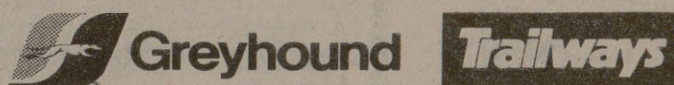

## Jordan gets MVP as East nips West

CHICAGO (AP) — Michael Jordan followed up his NBA slam-dunk title with a Most Valuable Player performance in the All-Star Game Sunday, scoring 40 points as the East defeated the West 138-133.

Dominique Wilkins, Jordan's slam-dunk rival in Saturday's competition that went down to Jordan's final dunk, was barely overshadowed again as he scored 29 for the East, which now leads the series 25-13.

The East built a 15-point lead in the fourth quarter although Jordan sat out for eight minutes with foul trouble.

The West got no closer than the final margin after that as Jordan returned to score 16 points in the final 5:50.

Jordan, the unanimous MVP after hitting 17 of 23 field goal shots, was only two points shy of the All-Star record of 42 by Wilt Chamberlain in 1962.

He more than doubled his total of 18 in two previous All-Star appearances.

Karl Malone led the West with 22 points, Akeem Olajuwon had 21 and Lafayette Lever scored 17.

Kareem Abdul-Jabbar scored 10 points and became the all-time leading All-Star scorer with 247 points in 17 appearances.

Magic Johnson had 17 points and 19 assists for the West.

The West, which trailed by as many as 10 points in the first half,

got two three-point plays from Jordan to close the deficit to 78-75:43 left in the third quarter.

Jordan went out with his foul at that point, but the East won on an 18-8 run to regain control. Wilkins had three baskets and Danny Ainge two 3-pointers that spurt.

Ainge had his third 3-point shot as Doc Rivers hit a free throw, giving the East a 109-94 lead with 5:00 remaining, and Jordan's return to the court later helped assure the East the victory.

Jordan scored 18 points in the first half as the East opened a 14-point lead.

The East spent the first quarter playing catch-up, tying the game four times but never taking the lead.

Malone, making his first All-Star appearance, scored eight points in the first 8:05, lifting the West to its largest lead, 24-16.

A 9-2 spurt by the East made it 25 before Clyde Drexler scored 25 points in less than two minutes. West gained a 34-27 advantage at 11:37 left in the half.

The West then went four minutes without a point, while Jordan and Wilkins scored four each during an 11-0 run that gave the East a lead.

Later in the second period, Jordan started a 12-4 spurt with a jumper and a breakaway dunk, and the East took its largest lead of the half, 56-46.

## Nine teams in top 20 fall over the weekend

For many of college basketball's top teams, it was a lost weekend.

Nine members of the Top 20 — including second-ranked Nevada-Las Vegas, No. 3 Brigham Young and No. 4 Duke — were beaten Saturday. Also losing were No. 14 Georgetown, No. 15 Vanderbilt, No. 16 Iowa State, No. 17 Illinois, No. 19 Florida and No. 20 St. John's.

Michael Charles and Reginald Turner each scored 24 points as Alabama-Birmingham handed visiting Brigham Young its first loss of the season, 102-83.

BYU Coach Ladell Andersen wasn't rattled by the defeat, which dropped the Cougars to 17-1.

"We're the same club we were two hours ago," he said. "I still feel great about this team."

Alabama-Birmingham, which led 39-37 at halftime, built a 19-point lead in the second half before Brigham Young cut the gap to 82-75 with 4:03 to play. But Charles scored nine points as the Blazers pulled away down the stretch.

Sunday, top-ranked Arizona defeated California, No. 6 Purdue met No. 11 Michigan and Notre Dame faced Duke. No. 8 North Carolina and No. 9 Pitt did not play over the weekend.

**Cal-Santa Barbara 71, No. 2 Nevada-Las Vegas 66**

Carrick DeHart scored 21 points as Cal-Santa Barbara beat visiting Nevada-Las Vegas for the second time this season.

The Gauchos trailed by 11 points early in the second half, then outscored the Runnin' Rebels 28-10 over the next 8½ minutes for a 56-49 lead.

Cal-Santa Barbara, which beat Nevada-Las Vegas 62-60 last month at Las Vegas, improved to 16-4 overall and 8-3 in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association. Nevada-Las Vegas fell to 20-2 and 9-2.

**N.C. State 77, No. 4 Duke 74**

Vinny Del Negro, held scoreless in the first half, scored eight points in the final three minutes, leading the Wolfpack past Duke in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The victory lifted the Wolfpack into a tie with Duke and North Carolina for the conference lead at 5-2. N.C. State improved to 14-4 overall, while Duke dropped to 15-3.

**No. 5 Temple 84, Rutgers 53**

Mike Vreeswyk scored 21 points as Temple handed Rutgers its 13th straight defeat. The Owls improved to 18-1 overall and 12-0 in the Atlantic 10.

Rutgers outscored Temple 19-3 late in the first half, drawing within 34-29, but Temple scored the final seven points of the half and coasted the rest of the way.

**No. 7 Oklahoma 120, Missouri 101**

Stacey King scored 40 points as Oklahoma beat Missouri in the Big Eight.

The 120 points were the most ever against Missouri, which has been playing basketball since 1906. The previous high was 112 by Kansas in 1974.

The Sooners improved to 20-2 overall and 6-1 in the conference, while Missouri fell to 13-5 and 3-3.

**No. 10 Kentucky 83, Mississippi St. 59**

Ed Davender scored 15 of his 21

points in the second half as the tucky routed Mississippi State in the Southeastern Conference.

Kentucky improved to 16-3 overall and 8-3 in the SEC, while Mississippi State fell to 11-9 and 3-7.

**No. 12 Syracuse 79, No. 13 John's 62**

Sherman Douglas scored 25 points as Syracuse downed St. John's in the Big East.

Rony Seikaly added 16 points for the Orangemen, who improved to 17-5 overall and 6-3 in the conference. Shelton Jones had 22 points for St. John's, which dropped to 5-5 and 5-4.

**No. 13 Iowa 101, Michigan 82**

Jeff Moe scored 19 points in his second start of the season as Iowa beat visiting Michigan State in the Big 10.

Moe scored seven points during a 22-4 run that put the Hawkeyes ahead 49-34 at halftime. Iowa's overall and 6-3 in the league.

**Connecticut 66, No. 14 Georgetown 59**

Cliff Robinson scored 16 points and blocked nine shots as Connecticut downed visiting Georgetown in the Big East.

Connecticut made eight straight foul shots in the final 1:23, clinching its first victory over Georgetown since 1982. The Huskies improved to 11-8 overall and 3-7 in the conference, while the Hoyas fell to 11-8 and 4-5.

**LSU 94, No. 15 Vanderbilt 78**

Ricky Blanton scored 25 points and Wayne Sims had 23 as Louisiana State snapped Vanderbilt's seven-game winning streak.

Vanderbilt fell to 14-5 overall and 7-4 in the SEC, while LSU improved to 11-8 and 6-4. Vanderbilt's Perdue had 29 points and seven rebounds.

**Oklahoma St. 80, No. 16 Iowa 78, OT**

John Starks hit an 18-foot shot with four seconds left in overtime as Oklahoma State handed Iowa State its fifth straight loss.

Jeff Grayer, who scored 35 points for Iowa State, was unable to get a desperation shot before time expired. Oklahoma State improved to 12-8 overall and 3-3 in the Big 10 while Iowa State dropped to 10-2 and 2-5.

**Indiana 75, No. 17 Illinois 71**

Freshman Jay Edwards scored 21 points, including two free throws with 32 seconds left, that gave Indiana the Big 10 victory.

Indiana improved to 13-6 overall and 5-4 in the conference. Illinois, which lost its fourth straight, fell to 14-8 and 4-5.

**No. 18 Bradley 85, Drake 67**

Hersey Hawkins, leading the team with a 36-point average, scored 32 as Bradley beat Drake in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The Braves improved to 10-2 overall and 5-2 in the conference. Eric Berger, who was Hawkins' school teammate in Chicago, scored 26 for Drake.

**Auburn 58, No. 19 Florida 57**

John Caylor scored 21 points as Auburn hit seven 3-point shots in the second half as the Tigers beat past Florida in the SEC.

Auburn beat Florida for the first straight time, denying Gators coach Norm Sloan his 600th career victory.
