# A&M men's tennis team shines in upset of 16th-ranked Trinity

An unusually large crowd of about 150 at the Omar Smith Tennis Center watched the A&M men's tennis team upset 16th-ranked Trinity 5-4.

No. 1 Dean Johnson won his match against Mauricio Silva 5-7, 6-1, 6-4.

"Deano really gutted up and came up with the big win, and that's the second time he has beaten Silva," Assistant Coach Tim Drain said. "He played an incredible match today."

Shaun O'Donovan, A&M's No. 2 player, lost to Mats Malmberg 6-2, 5-7, 6-1.

Kennedy defeated Eno Polo 6-4, 3-6, 6-1.

"Steve is playing great tennis right now, and he usually turns in a win," Drain said.

Whitaker played his usual consistent match, crushing Chris Greer 6-3, 6-4.

"Whitaker played the kind of match coaches don't have to worry about," Drain said. "We just let him take care of business and watched the other matches."

A&M's Michael Chambers lost to Greg Tourant 6-3, 6-4 and Scott Campell was defeated by Chad Marsh 6-1, 6-3.

A&M split the singles 3-3 and finished out the dual match by winning two of three doubles matches.

In the past few dual matches A&M has relied on its doubles teams to pull out a victory.

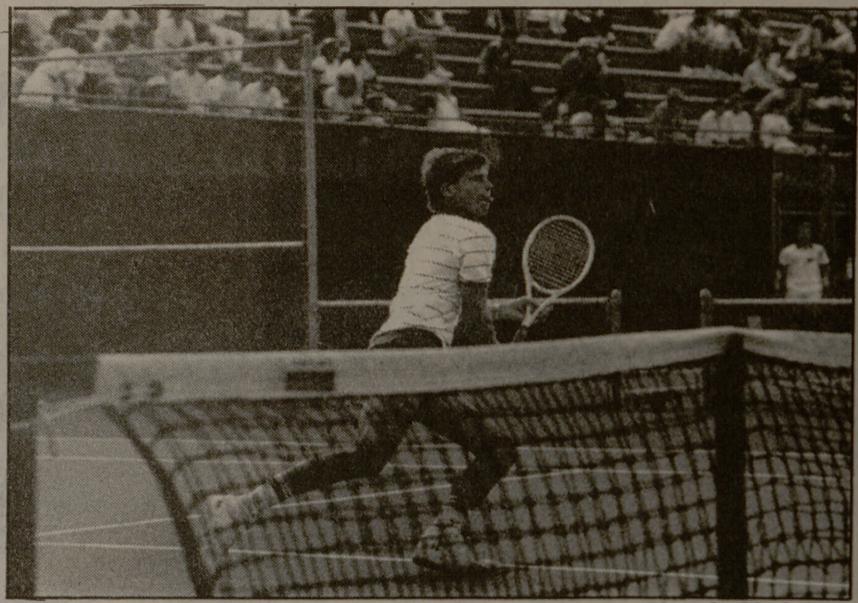

"Once we got out of singles at 3-3, we knew we were in a position to win," Drain said.

A&M No. 1 doubles team Kennedy and O'Donovan dominated Trinity's Silva and Sundh 6-4, 6-3.

No. 2 Whitaker and Johnson defeated Malmberg and Marsh 6-2, 6-2.

Trinity's Tourant and Manuel

Rodriguez defeated Campell and Chambers 6-4, 2-6, 6-4.

"Quite frankly, I'm surprised at our win, but that shows you what I know," Head Coach David Kent said. "It has been a long time since we have beat a team in the top 20."

"This is the very best tennis we've played in years."

# A&M sluggers lose 2-of-3 to Bulldogs

The Texas A&M baseball team kissed its unbeaten record goodbye when it lost two of its three games with Louisiana Tech the weekend in Ruston, La.

The Aggies took Friday's opening game 9-5, but then stumbled in Saturday's doubleheader, losing the opener 5-3 and falling 7 in the nightcap.

Tech hit two home runs in the opener and sent five more over the fence in the second game. A&M's Nick Felix, 3-1, was the losing pitcher in the first game. Randy Pryor took the loss in the second game, dropping his record to 1-1.

"It was one of those days where A&M Coach Mark Johnson said, 'We hit the ball hard, but in special spots it went right to them,'" Keller said.

In Saturday's first game, the Bulldogs exploded for five runs in the bottom of the second. Louisiana Tech's Todd Ross highlighted the inning with a grand slam, and then left-fielder Miller hit a solo home run.

A&M's Terry Taylor hit a three-run homer in the sixth. A&M's only runs in the game.

Miller also hit two 2-run homers in the second game.

A&M's Kirk Thompson hit a three-run home run in the fifth inning to pull A&M to within one at 6-5.
