

Jury ruling requires radio station to pay city property taxes

CONROE (AP) — A state district tions involving Swaggart and apr court jury ruled Wednesday that a titute. radio station owned by Jimmy Swaggart Ministries should pay \$28,000 taxes to the city of Shenandoah.

Swaggart Ministries, based in Baton Rouge, La., has claimed that radio station KJOJ-FM qualifies as a place of worship, and therefore is

But Shenandoah city officials said the station owed \$64,043 in real estate and personal property taxes.

Study will recommend plan for horse racing

DALLAS (AP) — A major consultants' study for the Texas Horse Racing Association will recommend to the state racing commission where, when and how pari-mutuel horse racing should be imple-

The association led the drive to pass pari-mutuel legislation in Texas. Consultants also could study the possibility of forming a non-profit organization to run all Class 1 tracks, or all those catering to thoroughbreds, said Preston Carter of Dallas, association president.

He said Wednesday such an organization might lower financing costs, eliminate racing calendar conflicts between tracks and "eliminate possible bad elements of ownership.


