Workers find loose material tests scheduled for shuttle

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Technicians on Thursday discovered loose insulation on a booster rocket and scheduled overnight tests to determine if the problem is serious enough to delay the first post-Challenger space shuttle flight.

The separation of the insulation from the booster casing was discovered on the bottom edge of one of four segments of the right rocket, officials at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration said.

Officials said if the debonding has not spread beyond that, it can be fixed here without affecting the Aug. 4 launch.

If the separation extends deeper into the insulation, the segment might have to be returned to the Morton Thiokol Inc. plant in Utah for repair and another segment substituted, NASA officials said.

Source speaking on condition of anonymity said that could delay launch of space shuttle Discovery several weeks.

Severe debonding could be the breakup of a rocket in flight, destroy the shuttle.

Experts were to use ultrasonic vices in their inspection.

Lisa Malone, a NASA spokesman said similar edge debonding has been found on other rocket segments in the past and had been paired here along with other

"We found some debonding among our people there is discussion of sending the segment to Utah," she said. "We have some measurements and send data to Morton Thiokol and Marshall Space Flight Center Huntsville, Ala."
