

# Workers find loose material tests scheduled for shuttle

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Technicians on Thursday discovered loose insulation on a booster rocket and scheduled overnight tests to determine if the problem is serious enough to delay the first post-Challenger space shuttle flight.

The separation of the insulation from the booster casing was discovered on the bottom edge of one of four segments of the right rocket, officials at the National Aeronautics

and Space Administration said. Officials said if the debonding has not spread beyond that, it can be fixed here without affecting the Aug. 4 launch.

If the separation extends deeperinto the insulation, the segment might have to be returned to the Morton Thiokol Inc. plant in Utah for repair and another segment substituted, NASA officials said.
