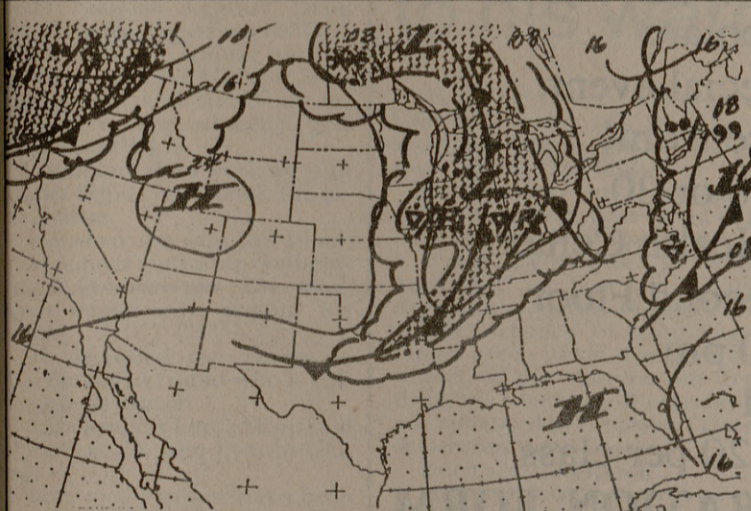

Map Discussion: The Pacific frontal system stretching from the Great Lakes into Texas and Southern New Mexico will pass Bryan-College Station early Wednesday. Meanwhile, southerly flow will produce a morning overcast of stratus today and tomorrow with some drizzle and a slight threat of showers Wednesday with the front.

Forecast:

Today: Overcast through the morning partly cloudy and warm for the afternoon. High 87 with south winds of eight to 14 mph. Expect light drizzle in the morning.

Tonight: Partly cloudy through midnight, then overcast. Low 64 degrees. Southerly winds three to eight mph.

Wednesday: Overcast through noon with a slight threat of showers with the Pacific cold frontal passage. High 80 degrees. Winds southerly at 10 to 16 mph early becoming northwesterly at 12 gusting to 20 behind the front. Chance of rain 20 percent.

Weather Fact: Haze - Fine dust or salt particles dispersed through a portion of the atmosphere; a type of lithometer. The particles are so small that they cannot be felt or individually seen with the naked eye, but they diminish horizontal visibility and give the atmosphere a characteristic opalescent appearance that subdues all colors.

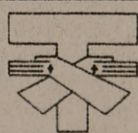
