

"We are focusing on children 2 to 8 years old and their rights to things like security and adequate housing and shelter," said Week of the Young Child Chairman Carol Eu-

One of the primary goals of the celebration, with the theme "We care for America's children," is to improve professional care of young children, Eubanks said.

Local observance of the week will begin Sunday at Manor East Mall where there will be several live per-formances aimed at entertaining young children, Eubanks said.

The festivities, taking place from noon to 5 p.m., will include performances by a children's choir, a dance school, gymnists, various clowns and Lester the Puppet, Eubanks said. In addition, 'Magination Station

will perform one-act plays that are designed for the enjoyment of young children, she said.

# District spokesman State is obligated to change funding

AUSTIN (AP) — Texas has an ommend a new system to obligation to replace the current lic schools. school finance system, which has been ruled unconstitutional, with one that is equitable, a spokesman for poor school districts said Thurs-

However, poor districts don't ex pect a future school finance system to give them the same ability to raise money as the state's richest districts, Richard Kirkpatrick told the Select Committee on Education.

Kirkpatrick heads a group of 55 low-wealth districts that joined a school finance lawsuit against the

"Common sense tells us that the state has a legitimate and compelling interest in not providing us the op-portunity to spend \$15,000 per stu-dent with a local tax effort of only a dime," said Kirkpatrick, Copperas Cove district superintendent.

"It seems perfectly clear to us that even if the state could raise that much money, it would not appropriate it for public education, and no court would or could require the state to do so," he said.

But it is wrong that the local proprty tax increase, needed to raise \$100 per student, should be 24 cents in the Edgewood district in San Antonio, for example, but only 6 cents in the Azle district, Kirkpatrick said.

The state "has the capacity, and we believe the responsibility, to adopt a system that would equalize the rates" for such districts, he said.
