

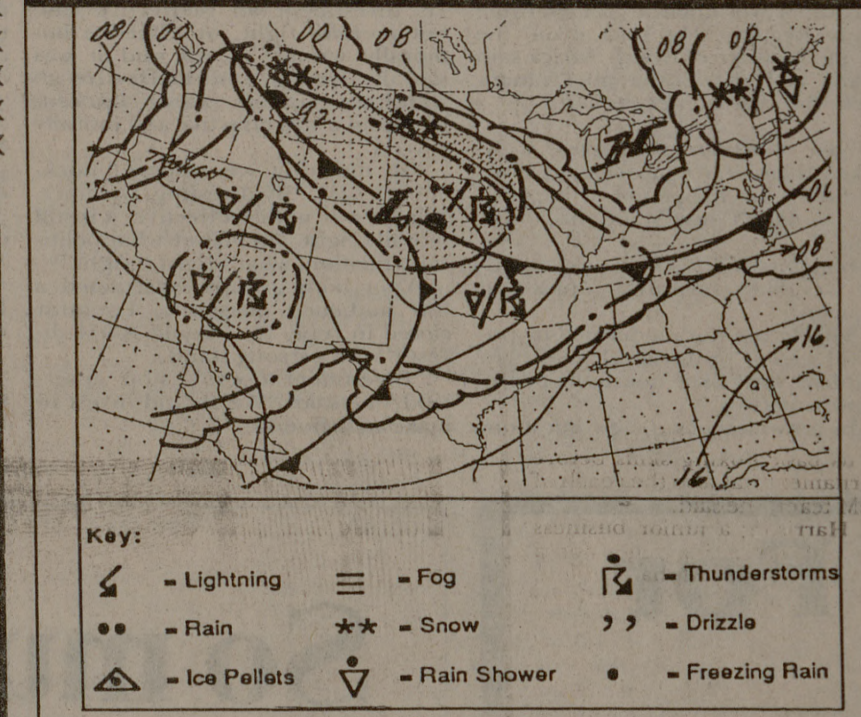

Weather Watch



Sunset Tonight: 7:55 p.m. Sunrise Friday: 6:49 a.m.

Map Discussion: The most active weather will be from the southwestern through the north-central states as an intense upper-level low pressure system migrates northeastward providing precipitation into the plains and the potential for severe weather in the central plains. The eastern United States will have a few snow showers over northern New England.

Forecasts:

Today: Overcast with stratus and fog through the morning becoming partly cloudy, warm and windy for the afternoon. A high of 87 with southerly winds at 5 to 10 mph through the morning becoming gusty by mid afternoon.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy and mild with a low around 69 and south winds of 3 to 8 mph.

Friday: Mostly cloudy with a threat of showers or thundershowers as the cold front passes through in the morning. A high of 78 with winds becoming northerly at 12 mph with gusts up to 22 mph. A 30 percent probability of precipitator.

Weather Fact: Hurricane reconnaissance: The first premeditated flight by a military aircraft into the eye of a hurricane took place on July 27, 1943, when Col. Joseph B. Duckworth and 1st Lt. Ralph O'Hair flew a single-engine AT-6 trainer from Bryan Field in Texas and penetrated the eye of a hurricane located between Galveston and Houston.

Appeals court grants 2 death row inmates new trials for murder

AUSTIN (AP) — Two Harris County men sentenced to death in unrelated 1977 murders were granted new trials Wednesday by the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals.

The court said John Charles Zimmerman Jr., convicted of abducting and killing his 10-year-old niece, should be retried because a letter he wrote to his wife wound up in investigators' hands. It was forwarded to them through Zimmerman's mother-in-law.

James Carol Williams, convicted of killing a service station clerk, was granted a new trial because a prospective juror was excused after expressing reservations about the death penalty.

The U.S. Supreme Court, in a case decided two years after Williams' trial, ruled that potential jurors cannot be excused on that basis.

The Court of Criminal Appeals has applied that decision retroactively in Texas cases.

"The passage of time has proven to be a true ally to" Williams, Judge M.P. Duncan III said in the Court of Criminal Appeals' unanimous decision to overturn Williams' conviction.

Williams was convicted in the July 6, 1977 shooting death of Mohamad Youssef Awada. He had been sentenced to die on Jan. 13 of this year, but the Court of Criminal Appeals stayed the execution on Jan. 5.

Zimmerman was found guilty in the March 24, 1977 stabbing death of Ramona Abner, his niece and a third-grade student at Jacinto City Elementary School. Zimmerman picked the girl up at school, apparently without the parents' permission, and sexually assaulted her before leaving her body at a construction site where he had worked.

While in jail, Zimmerman wrote a letter to his wife, Sherry Zimmerman, saying he had committed the murder.
