World leaders to talk about nuclear war

Man's apparent rush toward nuclear holocaust will be discussed by four world leaders Tuesday at 8 p.m. in the MSC Wiley Lecture Series program "Nuclear War: Thinking the Unthinkable."

William F. Buckley Jr. will moderate the discussion in Rudder Auditorium between former Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara, former British Prime Minister Lord James Callaghan and former U.S. Senator John Tower, Chris Eford, chairman of the program's organizing committee, said.

"We are looking forward to a very lively discussion between Buckley and McNamara," Eford said. "They are both extremely outspoken and they have very different beliefs on the subject. Nobody should go to sleep."

Eford, a political science major from Huntsville, said the panel will debate issues ranging from the Cold War and the Cuban missile crisis to the Strategic Defense Initiative.

Prospects for peace from general disarmament to the offensive SDI project also will be discussed.

Buckley has received awards and honorary degrees, an author, columnist, television host, lecturer and editor of the conservative magazine *National Review*. McNamara was secretary of defense during the Cuban missile crisis and the Cold War. Callaghan was prime minister from 1976 to 1979 and Tower was chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee and a negotiator of Strategic Nuclear Arms at the Geneva negotiations with the Soviet Union, Eford said.

Rice senior told to pay \$1,500 fine for prank

HOUSTON (AP) — A Rice University senior, who was placed on probation and told to pay \$1,500, for moving a 2,000-pound bronze statue of the school's founder says the prank was fun.

"Basically, I accepted the responsibility," Patrick Dyson, 23, said. The mathematical science major said he worked on the project as a "consultant."

"It was in the true spirit of college pranks and of a great engineering school," he said Wednesday, adding that his probation will not interfere with his May 7 graduation.

"It was a fun thing to do, to make people smile and laugh," Dyson said of his prank. No one has criticized us, except for the president (George Rupp) and the proctor (E.C. Holt). And it's their job to criticize us for it."

The 58-year-old statue of William Marsh Rice rests atop a granite base containing an urn holding the founder's remains.

Before dawn on April 12, 10 students placed two 200-lb A-frame supports around the statue and, using a wooden crossbar and three chain hoists, lifted the statue by nylon straps. About an hour later the statue faced Fondren Library the west, instead of Lovett Administration building to the east.

A campus policeman reported students leaving the area and the statue scattered. Dyson said he was stopped driving a pickup truck used to carry equipment for the project.

The fine was what it cost to have the statue in the right direction, said. To cover the fine, Dyson has raised about \$900 by selling shirts with graphics of the statue.

Holt, the school's chief disciplinary officer and chairman of the civil engineering department, said, "There was the potential for kinds of bad things to happen."
