



Insurance plan gives discounts for seat belt

AUSTIN (AP) — A proposal before the State Board of Insurance would give Texas drivers discounts of 15 percent to 30 percent on automobile insurance if their cars have air bags or automatic seat belts.

The proposal was submitted by the Texas Automobile Insurance Service Office, an industry organiza-

Only private passenger autos would be eligible for the discount. The 15 percent discount would apply to autos with passive restraints only for the driver, while the 30 percent discount would apply if front-

seat passengers also are protected.

"Although the exact amount of the discount will vary according to

the rating territory in which the is garaged, typical savings wou \$5 to \$11 per year on the star \$2,500 of personal injury prition," John Nance, chairman service office, said.

Campus investigates distruction of nests

ODESSA (AP) — School officials grouse that hundreds of swallows' nests on the University of Texas-Permian Basin campus are a nasty

But U.S. Fish and Wildlife officials say the birds have a right to nest there and plan to investigate the destruction of nests by UTPB maintenance workers this week.

Workers at UTPB began wrecking hundreds of swallows' nests built

recently by the migratory birds beneath overhanging cement structures on the campus' main building.

While it's permissible to destroy incomplete nests, tearing down active ones and breaking eggs violates the Migratory Bird Treaty and is punishable by a \$200 fine or harsher, court-ordered action, Robert Lee, an investigator for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Lubbock, said.

University spokeswoman Yvonne Harris said Monday that Bruce Revell, UTPB's chief business officer, ordered the destruction of partiallybuilt nests about two weeks ago to

discourage the birds from nes the school's main building.

Harris said that on one temporary worker knocked do nest that contained eggs.
