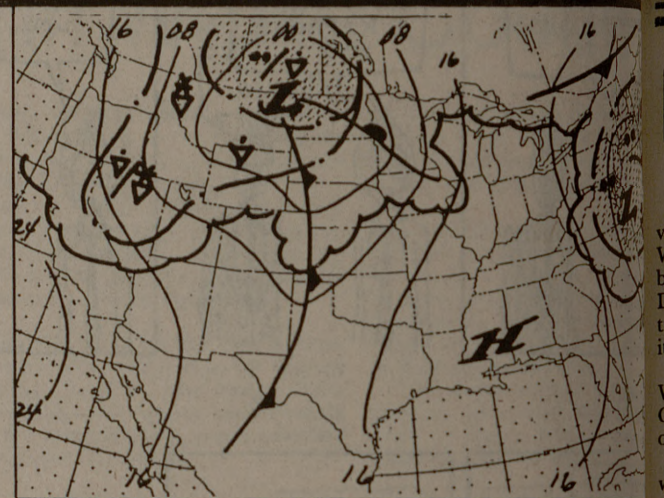

Map Discussion: High pressure over the southern Mississippi Valley will be the primary influence locally with partly cloudy and warm conditions and a gradual return of moisture from the Gulf of Mexico as the winds return to the South. The persistent low along the East Coast will continue to produce precipitation from North Carolina into Maine while the intense upper system in the West will be the cause of scattered rain showers with some snow in the higher elevations.

Tonight: Fair with early morning stratus and some fog. Low temperature will be in the 60s, with winds from the southeast at three to five mph.

A&M collection gives genetic study material

Underneath the Sterling C. Evans Library is a collection of various skins, skulls and skeletons. It is the Texas Cooperative Wildlife Collection, which scientists use to compare and contrast mammals' physical structures.

Now, new data will allow scientists to discern genetic differences as well.

Taking samples of frozen tissues from some specimens in the collection will complement the traditional taxidermic preparations of the mammals.

Wildlife sciences lecturer Paisley Cato said the tissue samples— including heart, liver and kidney— will be used to examine the DNA of mammals. "It's like a three-dimensional library," she said.

Among tissue study techniques are chromosomal banding, which involves treatments of the chromosomes themselves, and electrophoresis— putting an electrical current through a protein sample.

The tissues will be frozen in cold freezers which are filled with liquid nitrogen and kept at -196 degrees Celsius, Cato said. Freezing prolongs the life of the protein tissues. Without freezing, the tissues would decay and experimentation would not be possible, she said.

Cato said the tissue samples— including heart, liver and kidney— will be used to examine the DNA of mammals. "It's like a three-dimensional library," she said.

Spring season brings trouble with asphalt on Texas highways

AUSTIN (AP) — Bill Ward says the biggest one he saw was out near Yoakum back in 1981, and it blocked a whole highway.

"It was so big you could fit a city bus in it and, if I'm not mistaken, a pickup truck was stuck at the bottom," Ward said. "You could say it was a pothole of Herculean proportions."

Blacktop rarely unravels to the point described by Ward, coordinator of the Transportation Research Center at the University of Texas. The former Highway Department official said "the whole road just disappeared" when a sulfur mine undermined the asphalt.

Sooner or later, however, every motorist experiences the sickening feeling of bearing down on an axle-snapping, wheel-warping, hubcap-stealing pothole at 60 mph.

Spring is pothole season and repair crews are up to their asphalt in alligator cracks — as blacktop fractures are known.

There is good and bad news where the rubber meets the road. Engineers have thoroughly researched the dynamics of potholes and scientists are applying the knowledge to create a new generation of paving materials. But construction and maintenance costs are becoming so high that politicians

may balk when it's time to build maintain highways.

The Federal Highway Administration lists 285,962 miles of ways, roads and streets in more than in New York and California combined. If stretched out end, the state's pavement could reach the moon and complete a bit.

Keeping Texans rolling is expensive. Scores of federal, state, and city agencies spent more than \$900 million to patch an estimated 90 million potholes across the state during fiscal year 1986.

John Cagle, a spokesman for the Texas Highway Department, said "People think that once a highway is built, it's forever, like the pyramids in Egypt, but we are continually building."

Cagle said an average street asphalt lasts 20 years. And Texas' share of abuse: scorching summers, numbing Amarillo winters, seemingly endless 18-week rolling through. Ant colonies nesting under the road are blamed for potholes near Miles.

Robert McGennis, regional director of the Asphalt Institute, said roads or street is immune from potholes.
