Sources, meanwhile, told the San Antonio Express-News and the San Antonio Light that Brown, who guided the Jayhawks to the NCAA title this year, also was among the candidates. Brown earlier this spring rejected an offer to return to UCLA as coach, and as recently as Monday, when his name was mentioned for the Houston Packets job, in for the Houston Rockets job, in-sisted he was staying at Kansas. Several players said they were surprised by the firing.

Brown told the Light Tuesday he had not spoken directly to McCombs about the vacancy, but added the San Antonio coaching position could be perfect for him.

"I'm partial to (former) ABA cities," Brown said. "I love San Antonio."

I'm happy with the way this team is. I think we're on track and this is going to be a great team and I'm just sorry I'm not going to be

Besides a poor record, the Spurs have been plagued with dwindling attendance that last year was the league's lowest. Gate revenue was \$78,000 per game, compared to an NBA average of \$170,000.

Weiss' ouster is the second change McCombs has made. Bob Bass, vice president for basketball operations, last week was appointed administrative assistant and is now responsible for free agents and contract negotiations.
