Richard Gardner, special agent in charge of the Bureau of Alco-nol, Tobacco and Firearms office n Dallas, said the investigators vill work with other bureaus round the country to stop the un flow from Texas, second only to Florida in weapons sup-plied to Jamaican drug gangs in

Since mid-1986, there have een at least 1,200 guns confiscated in other cities that can be raced to purchases in the Dallas area for the gangs, Gardner said. Texas laws allow any adult with

a valid Texas driver's license to ouy unlimited amounts of guns, with no background check or waiting period.

# Reviewer: Van Halen album rides border of predictibility

They're back! The boys of Van Halen are back with their eighth album, OU812. And it would be nice to say it is their best effort yet, that the veterans of hard rock 'n' roll are on the cutting edge of the music scene, but that would be bordering on a lie.
