

Survey: Seatbelt use jump up to 60 percent in Texas

Six out of 10 Texans have added a step to their driv-

ing routine by buckling up when getting behind the wheel, a recent survey revealed.

The Texas Transportation Institute for the highway department reported an increase in safety-belt usage within the past six months. The institute conducted a survey of 18 cities and found an increase from 54.1 percent in January to 59.2 in June, a gain of 5.1 percent.

A law mandating seat-belt use took effect Sept. 1, 1985, but tickets were not issued until Jan. 1, 1986, said Gary Trietsch, safety and traffic operations engineer with the highway department.

After the law went into effect, seat-belt usage averaged 66.1 percent but dropped to 55.7 percent by January of this year. Over the past six months the average has increased to 60.6 percent, a 4.9 percent rise.

"We attribute much of the rise to stronger law forcement efforts," Trietsch said. "Without police there writing tickets, some people just won't taken to buckle up.

'We're very encouraged by the increase in safety use. Public education is important in getting people understand why they should use seat belts, but its

some people have to believe they really might go ticket before they'll change their behavior." The city showing the highest usage rate was Cor Chisti with 83.3 percent, followed by Austin with an of 72.5 percent. However, Laredo showed the high increase in percentage of seat-belt use between Jan and June with an increase of 17.7 percent.

El paso was next with a 17-point rise, followed Tyler with a 14.3 percent increase.

AIDS victim sues lawfirm for prejudice

AUSTIN (AP) — In the first case of its kind in Austin, a man with AIDS has sued one of the city's largest law firms, alleging job discrimi-

Gilbert R. Nieto filed suit in state District Court against the law firm of Clark, Thomas, Winters & Newton, contending that the firm discriminated against him by firing him after he was diagnosed with AIDS-related

complex in August 1987. Barry Bishop, a partner with Clark, Thomas, Winters & Newton, denied that Nieto was fired because of his disease.

"AIDS had nothing whatsoever to do with that decision," Bishop said.

In the lawsuit filed Monday Nieto seeks reinstatement to his job as a paralegal with the firm, restoration of his insurance benefits, back pay, attorneys' fees and an unspecified amount of damages for mental and physical anguish."

His attorney, Phil Durst, said the lawsuit was filed after the Austin Human Rights Commission ruled in Nieto's favor in July on a complaint he had filed with the agency about

"They made a finding that there was cause to believe that discrimination had occurred," Durst said.


