Camp concert tonight

Contemporary Christian singer Steve Camp will perform an evangelical benefit concert tonight at 7:30 in Rudder Auditorium.

"I enjoy my concerts and I love college audiences," Camp says. "I hope they (A&M students) come ready to get crazy and dance and sing. I also hope that after it's over we can walk away closer as friends."

Camp hopes the concerts will strengthen the faith of Christians and clear up misgivings others may have about Christianity.

"Because I do contemporary Christian music, the heart of my music is centered around the Lord," Camp says. "A lot of people are unfamiliar with Christianity or turned off by the scandals last year. That's not what real Christianity is about. I want to give people hope about what and who the Lord really is."

Camp's singing career began in 1978 with the release of his first album, "Sayin' It With Love," a collection of love

songs. He included one "overtly Christian" song, which received favorable reviews.

The label with which he had a contract folded, and he was offered a contract with Arista. Feeling the pressure from the uncertain future, Camp decided to leave the music business and move back to Illinois. He attended a junior college for a while and eventually turned back to music.

When he started singing again, he talked to other Christian singers for advice.

"People said my music would be too rock for the Christian stores or too Christian for the rock stores," he says. "I just wanted to sing about the Lord. I went through a lot of pain and God used it to sharpen my vision. My music alone is empty, but with the Lord it is powerful."

Camp wrote all the songs on his album "After God's Own Heart." Some of the musicians on the record include members of Chicago and the bass player for Phil Collins.

Camp has also been involved in the "Christians Artists United to Save the Earth" (CAUSE), the Christian response to Band-Aid.

Now with the AIDS epidemic, Camp and other Christian singers formed "AIDS Crisis and Christians Today" (ACCT), an organization to assist AIDS patients.

"The church has been silent and needs to come out," Camp says. "We want to educate people on the touchability we should have with AIDS patients. Jesus ministered to the people others shunned. People with AIDS are treated like modern day lepers."

Camp and his wife Kim, who have been married for one year, learned last week that they are expecting their first child.

"It's a little sooner than we thought, but it's wonderful," he says.

Camp hopes that his concert will inspire A&M students to choose Christianity. For ticket information call 846-3433.
