In his testimony, he set out several points designed to "clean up" A&M's athletic program, including the establishment of an intercollegiate athletic compliance director, communication with former students on the school's intent to dissociate them from the athletic program following NCAA recruiting violations and disciplinary actions against athletic department staff involved in the viola-

Thirty-one allegations of rules violations and seven procedural violations were cited in the original letter gain institutional control, which rests from the NCAA.


