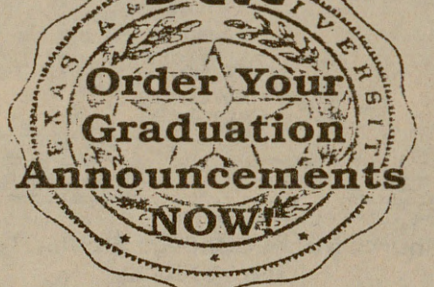

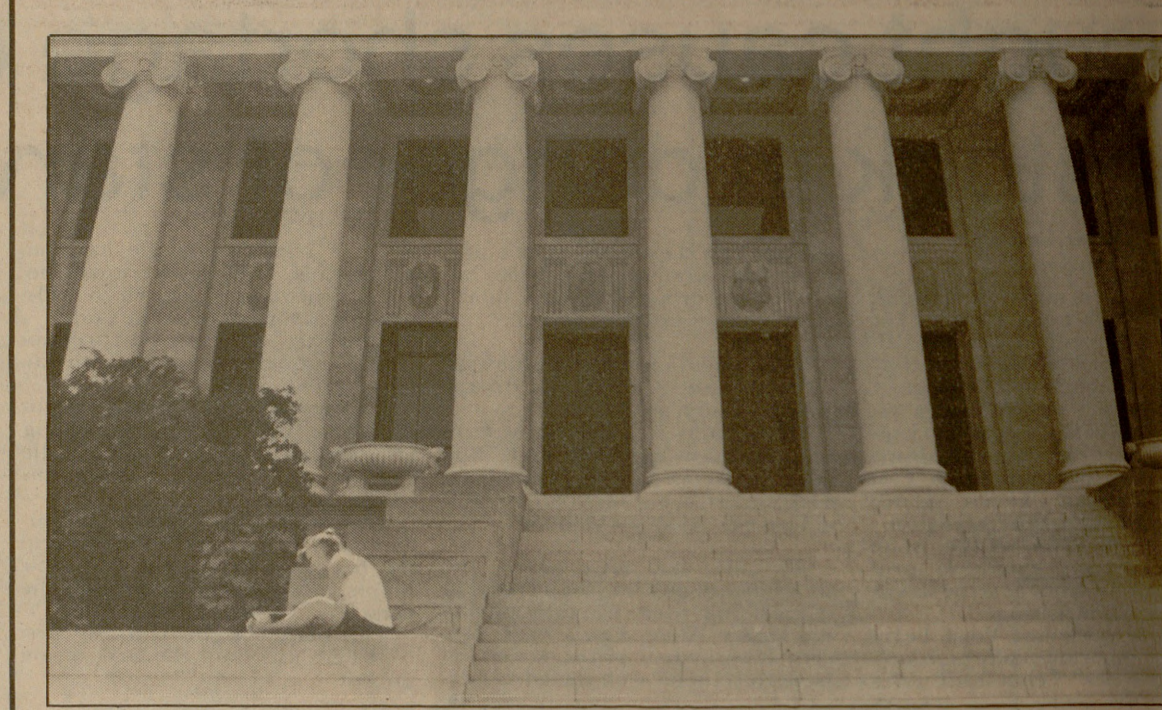

First nuclear plant draws opposition before its opening

XALAPA, Mexico (AP) — An unlikely coalition of wealthy housewives and cattlemen is spearheading opposition to Mexico's first nuclear power plant.

The plant, Laguna Verde, has been a pet project of the governing Institutional Revolutionary Party for more than 20 years.

But the party, which lost ground to the opposition in the July 6 general election, announced soon afterward that it was delaying the plant's startup.

"After July 6, nothing is the same," Rebecca Labastida, a founder of the Mothers of Veracruz Anti-nuclear Committee, said.

That group is one of several that have been working to get the plant mothballed or converted to non-nuclear fuel.

The coalition of urban housewives and cattle ranchers fighting the project includes members of the governing party.

"A social consciousness is growing in Mexico," regional planner Tomas Berlin, who just finished a book critical of Laguna Verde, said. "One point is nuclear energy. In it you will see a new face of Mexico."

Many residents in Xalapa, 140 miles east of Mexico City, oppose the plant, which is located 40 miles outside the city on a winding road dotted with roadside stands laden with local honey, cheese and fruit.

Sugar cane carpets the steamy coastal plain where white power pylons march down to the Gulf of Mexico and the green lagoon that gave its name to Mexico's first nuclear plant.

Inside the 13-story Unit One containment building, uranium fuel rods wait in a dry concrete pool next to 657-megawatt reactor from the United States.

The men who are building the plant say they are confident of its safety and are ready to turn on the first two reactors.

"The first unit is ready," project spokesman Hector Luna Lastra said recently. "It's a political decision now."

Critics say the reactor, made by the U.S.-based General Electric Co., and its containment building are

dangerous and obsolete.

The William H. Zimmer plant in Ohio, which had a reactor of the same design, is being converted to coal fuel.

The owners sued, alleging the reactor design was flawed, and won an out-of-court settlement of more than \$78 million.

The Union of Concerned Scientists says all similar plants should be phased out because the containment building could leak radioactive materials.

"The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has concluded there is a 90 percent chance that it (the containment building) will break if there is a meltdown," Robert Pollard, a nuclear safety engineer, said from Washington.

Laguna Verde is all that is left of a grand plan for a nationwide network of 20 nuclear plants.

The idea died when oil prices plunged, but Laguna Verde lived on, despite a price tag that rose from \$263 million to \$3.5 billion.

The project was announced in 1968. Construction began in 1973, and for years the project moved quietly along, providing thousands of jobs.

Opposition to Laguna Verde began in April 1986 after the nuclear accident at Chernobyl in the Soviet Union, Patricia Ortega, another founder of Mothers of Veracruz, said.

The explosion and fire at the Soviet plant killed 31 people and sent a cloud of radiation around the world.

The Federal Electricity Commission countered criticism of Laguna Verde with a public relations campaign, but the opposition kept growing.

Jury selection for rape trial resumes today

SAN DIEGO, Texas (AP) — Jury selection began Monday for the sexual assault trial of Orlando Garza, one of 10 men indicted in the alleged gang rape and kidnapping of a 19-year-old woman.

It is the first case to go to trial since the woman reported she was abducted the night of March 26 and taken to a building north of this Duval County town where a cock fight was taking place.

The woman, who has two children, told authorities she was raped repeatedly by as many as 20 men while onlookers ignored her pleas for help.

She also reported being sexually assaulted at two other locations before she was dropped near her home several hours later the alleged kidnapping.

After lengthy pre-trial motions by defense attorneys, jury selection finally began late Monday. The deliberations were recessed at 7 p.m. Monday. Jury selection is to continue Tuesday.

State District Judge Ricardo Garcia denied motions by the defense to have the sexual assault trials of Garza and 23-year-old Corando Perez Jr. combined.

Defense attorneys Nago Alamo and Albert Pena represent the two along with three other defendants.

Judge Garcia also denied defense motions to quash the jury panel and to allow the potential jurors to be interviewed individually in the voir dire process.

The judge granted a prosecution motion, however, to prohibit discussion of the woman's past sexual history in the presence of the jury without first determining if such discussion would be admissible evidence.

Defense attorney Pena protested that limiting references to the sexual history touches on the basis of the defense of consent.

On the motion to quash the jury, the defense attorneys attempted to show that the panel would be stacked in the prosecution's favor because of the presence of several relatives of Assistant District Attorney Rod Carrillo.
