

Lady Aggies take 4th at SMU golf tourney

The Lady Aggies golf team finished fourth in the Southern Methodist University Classic at Brook Haven Country Club in Dallas Tuesday. Texas Christian finished first with a three-day total of 884 strokes, Southern Methodist finished second with 886, and North Texas placed third with 904.

Caroline Basarab led all Lady Aggie golfers Tuesday with a 70, one stroke off the lead and six shots behind SMU's Angie Ravaoli three-day total of 215.

Other Lady Aggies were Adriana Penuela, who finished 14th with a total of 227 strokes, Kelli Kiter was 16th with a 230 stroke total, Rebecca Sims was 17th with a 231, and Dee Davidson finished 23rd at 239.

The Lady Aggies' next competition will be Sept. 22-25 at the All-College Classic in Edmond, Oklahoma.

Rijo, 3-run 7th help Reds beat Astros 5-2

CINCINNATI (AP) — Jose Rijo allowed three hits in seven innings and Dave Collins' pinch-hit single ignited a three-run seventh inning Tuesday night, carrying the Cincinnati Reds to a 5-2 victory over the Houston Astros.

Cincinnati built a 2-0 lead as Eric Davis singled home a first-inning run and Jeff Reed hit a solo homer in the second off Mike Scott, 13-7, who hasn't won since Aug. 13.

A throwing error by reliever Larry Andersen set up run-scoring singles in the seventh by Collins, Barry Larkin and Kal Daniels.

Rijo, 13-8, allowed just three singles in his second start since coming off the disabled list Sept. 8, recovered from tendinitis in his right elbow. Rijo has allowed just five hits in 13 scoreless innings in the two starts, both victories.

Rob Murphy allowed an eighth-inning RBI single to Glenn Davis and John Franco got four outs for his 33rd save, giving up a run-scoring single to Kevin Bass in the ninth.

Scott allowed six hits over six innings and struck out five in losing for the fourth fourth time in six starts.

Cincinnati scored in the first as Chris Sabo singled, stole his 44th base, moved up on Daniels' groundout and scored on Davis' single to left, his National League-leading 20th game-winning RBI.

Reed hit the first pitch from Scott in the second inning for his second NL homer and the fourth of his career. His other NL homer was with Montreal last June 26 off the Reds' Bill Gullickson.

Andersen helped the Reds score two more runs in the seventh. He walked Reed and threw wildly to first on Ron Oester's bunt, putting the runners in scoring position. Collins' pinch-hit single scored Reed, and Larkin followed with an RBI single. Daniels' infield single off Dave Meads completed the scoring.

Walk wins 1st since July, Pirates beat Mets

NEW YORK (AP) — Bob Walk won for the first time since July 20 and Bobby Bonilla hit a run-scoring double Tuesday night as the Pittsburgh Pirates beat the New York Mets 1-0.

The loss snapped the Mets' five-game winning streak and cut their lead over second-place Pittsburgh to 10 games in the National League East.

New York won 12 of 18 games this season against the Pirates.

Walk had lost six consecutive decisions since beating San Diego. He allowed five hits, walked two and struck out two in eight innings Tuesday to improve to 12-10. Jim Gott finished for his 29th save.

Dwight Gooden, 17-7, lost to Pittsburgh for the third time this season. He allowed five hits and struck out seven in seven innings.

Rice slam beats O's 6-4, keeps Bosox hot

BOSTON (AP) — Jim Rice hit his eighth career grand slam and the Boston Red Sox beat the Baltimore Orioles 6-4 Tuesday night for their seventh victory in nine games.

Lee Smith got his 25th save, helping the Red Sox maintain their lead in the American League East. Boston is 4½ games ahead of New York and Detroit.

Mike Smithson, 8-5, gave up two runs on four hits in 5 2-3 innings. The Orioles scored twice in the eighth against Bob Stanley before Smith relieved for the final four outs.

Rice spoiled the major league debut of Pete Harnisch with his 12th home run of the season. Wade Boggs began the Boston third with a double and Mike Greenwell and Ellis Burks walked with two outs, loading the bases.

Maddux, Cubs break losing streaks, win 9-2

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Greg Maddux won his first game since Aug. 10 and Damon Berryhill hit his first career grand slam as the Chicago Cubs beat the Philadelphia Phillies 9-2 Tuesday night, snapping a five-game losing streak.

Maddux, 17-7 after a 15-3 start, allowed six hits in seven innings, struck out six and walked none. He allowed solo home runs to Lance Parrish and Phil Bradley in the fifth.


Kevin Gross, 11-14, lost his sixth consecutive decision since Aug. 12, giving up four runs and six hits 3 2-3 innings.

Dave Winfield started the New York eighth with a single, his third hit of the game, off reliever Don Gordon. One out later, Aguayo met Scott Bailes, 8-13, with his third home run of the season for the Yankees.


