In addition, he may be one of the most talented receivers in the nation that can't showcase his talents because A&M's passing game hasn't been exactly outstanding since Kevin Murray left.

The opinion of many players right now is that even though they can't go to Dallas on New Year's Day they can still prove they are the best team in the Southwest Conference.

To end the season in the Top 10, the Aggies not only have to win the SWC, but win every game in the process — a feat that hasn't been accomplished very often.

Also, a mediocre season added with NCAA probation isn't very enticing to blue-chip athletes.

The Alabama game is also important to the SWC, because it isn't doing very well against good teams this preseason




