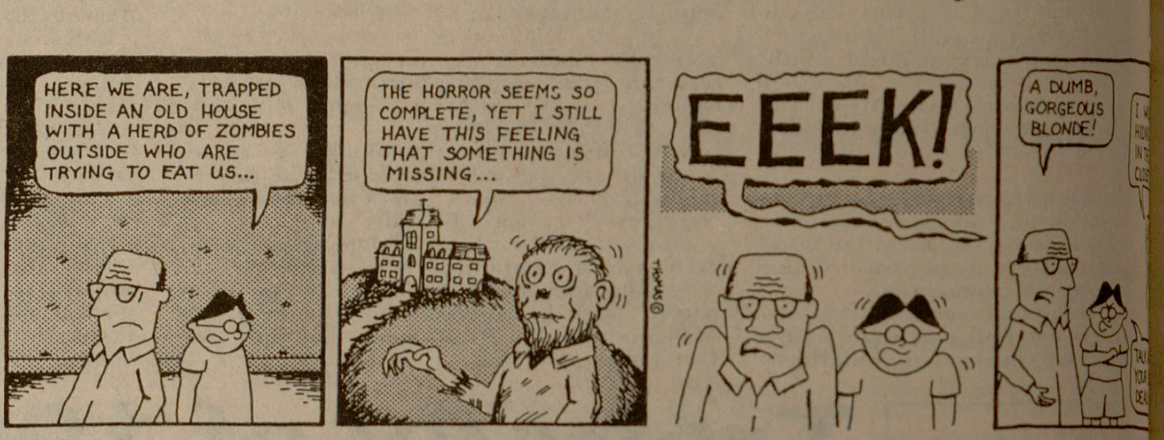

Music school's graduate goes home as new dean

DENTON (AP)— Thomas Wolfe notwithstanding, you can go home again. At least you can if you're the new dean of the School of Music at the University of North Texas.

Dr. Robert L. Blocker, who was named to the UNT position in May, received his doctor of musical arts degree from the university in 1972 after earning his master's in music at UNT in 1970. Much has changed since then.

The university's School of Music now is the second largest in the nation, with internationally recognized programs. And the then-new graduate has since served as dean of music at Baylor University, dean at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and chairman at Stephen F. Austin, Brevard College in North Carolina and at Western Texas College.

"I'm certainly going to try, because I can't do anything else, but do it," he said. "If one really loves his art, he is consumed by his art. Though the seed was planted much earlier, I first discovered I had that love when I was a student here."

"It is a way to lose oneself in a very special journey that carries a world of beauty and joy. I find (performing) compliments administrative duties."

Blocker said he selected the program purposefully, with the works representing historical moments in

his life as a university student of piano.

Blocker's first formal ensemble over will be the Emerald Sody Ball to be held Sept. 23 at Amon G. Carter Roundtop in Fort Worth.

He recognizes the important faculty in the curriculum process and remembers their role in the life not only of the but of their students.

"My memories of this school warm because of the carrying here," he said.

But much remains the same: Blocker's identification with students and his love of his alma mater.

His memories of his graduate student days are vivid and he sees enough of himself in the students here to put himself in their place.

"If I were to greet the graduate students with tales of my time here, I would be met with the same kind of blind stares, the stare of someone thinking, 'I've got to take a practice test in 30 minutes and this joker is going down memory lane.'"

So, Blocker's emphasis will be on dreams and plans for the future and a healthy respect for the past.

Professor to race 200 of his students

At this Saturday's Sixth Annual Health Run, sponsored by the College of Medicine, you will find a man who takes his racing to heart.

Dr. Elvin E. Smith, professor of medical physiology and president-elect of the Texas Affiliate of the American Heart Association is challenging his medical students to a race.

"I will give a trophy to every medical student who beats me," Smith said.

Smith will be competing against 200 of his students, he said, but does not plan to give away a single trophy. "I usually win," Smith said.

Smith's winning spirit stems from the great interest he has in the human heart. These same interests are shared by the AHA, he said.

The AHA is a group of people working together to prevent premature death and disability due to heart and vascular disease, Smith said.

By manipulating exercise, weight, and diet, people can greatly reduce their risk of heart failure, he said.

"A sedentary lifestyle is a risk factor," Smith said.

Smith said aerobic exercise is a

good way to reduce both cholesterol levels, and he mends it highly.

As president of the AHA, Smith said he plans to support their cardiovascular science research, as well as the professional education plan.

"We really don't know how high blood pressure," Smith said. "There are no classic symptoms. Through further research, someday know."

As part of the education, the association is gearing up efforts toward the public.

This week, for instance, the association is participating in a wide effort to increase the awareness of fat and cholesterol in the food they consume.

"Many of the prepared breads are just loaded with salt, and palm oil and nut oil are no-no's."

High levels of low density lipoprotein cholesterol and fat increase one's risk of heart failure, Smith said, and we are trying to help them make wise food selections.

"A poor heart usually fails over the years," Smith said. "Poor eating habits start when you are young."
