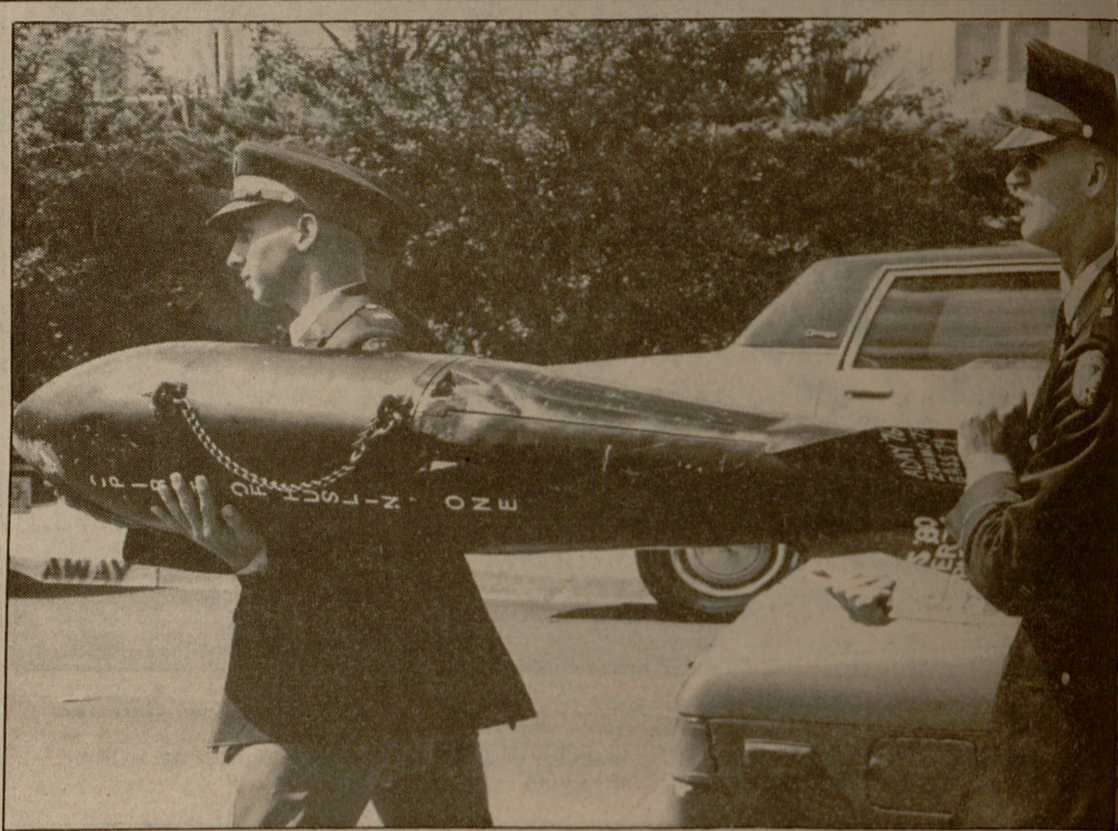

## Former activist still demands equality for Hispanic people

EL PASO (AP) — Raul Estrada no longer wears the Mexican serape that symbolized the Chicano Movement back in 1971.

But his goals are unchanged: he's still demanding justice for Hispanics.

Debbie Frieze Torres, a radical activist in turbulent early 1970s, is now a conservative Republican who sees her goals transcending equality for a single ethnic group. "Now, I'm concerned with do we really accept each other as humans," she said. "God accepts us, but do we accept ourselves?"

Ramon Reyes is still dedicated to educating Hispanics and to the ideal of equality, but he envisions different tools than the confrontations of the early '70s. "I believe the new movement will be more intellectual, more thought oriented, rather than physically violent, as it was in the 1970s," he said.

Estrada, Torres, and Reyes helped form the core of the Chicano Movement in El Paso in 1971 — a movement that began with the takeover of the president's office at the university and led to increasingly violent confrontations with police.

As students battled with local riot police and chained themselves to university doors, the Chicano Movement was born — if never formally organized. Its basic goals: to increase opportunities for Hispanics, and to protest the war in Vietnam.

Seventeen years later, Estrada, Torres and Reyes agree the changes they sought have not come about. At least, not in the way they had thought or to the extent they demanded.

Estrada, a playwright and political

activist, said he no longer wears serapes, but his hunger for social change has not been filled.

"My clothes may be different," he said. "I'm at least 18 years older. But, I still don't see the changes in our society that I would like to see, and for which I fought."

"Politically, the Chicano still has a long way to go. We haven't reached the levels of sophistication I expected. But, that's coming. I can feel it. As long as we don't give up the fight, and as long as we continue to make demands for change, something will give."

"Eventually, we will get what we desire, which is equality and the end of discrimination against Chicanos. We could also use a lot less government. It's ridiculous that we're even forced to wear seat belts in our own vehicles."

Torres, who now counsels students for the Ysleta Independent School District, said she sees Chicanos dealing with the same problems as they did then. She, however, has changed radically from her days as a student activist.

"I'm no longer the radical I was," Torres said. "Or, at least, my radical views now take a different slant." For example, Torres said, the way to change someone is to change their heart first. The rest will follow.

"I now consider myself a conservative Republican, which is quite a departure from my radical student days. I tended to go to the extreme left, but now, because of my life experiences, my philosophies have expanded."

"Discrimination is just a symptom of society. When I came to grips with the question of God, my whole life changed."

## Museum finds lost painting from 1735

CANYON (AP) — So-ken, serious-minded Dru- gler has been downgrader recently.

Spangler, the senior conservator at Paulhan's Historical Museum's Creation Center, and Kathryn associate paints conservator, summer uncovered a painting by the English painter William Hogarth (1764).

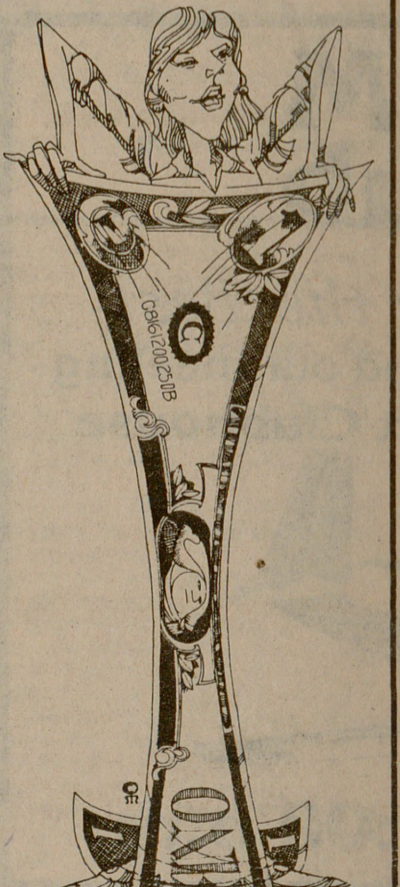
The 50-inch by 40-inch portrait of Mrs. Richard (Anne) Farwell, painted in 1735 and in the museum in 1948 and from the late James D. Farwell. Michael R. Gray, museum's curator of an investigation into the painting's authenticity last year discovered that the man has been listed as "whore unknown" after 1901.

A major stumbling block in proving the portrait's authenticity was the repainting of the done sometimes between 1929 and 1929. (Hamlin purchased painting in 1929.)

While Grauer researched the painting's provenance, Spangler and Hird went to work on the mystery of the portrait. Infrared photography revealed the original face, painted by Farwell.

"The infrared proved through layers of the painting visible to the human eye," Spangler said. "When we saw the original face was there, we examined it in ultraviolet light at that point we knew we definitely proved it."
