Nuclear activists attempt to block Mexican facility

of Mexico's first nuclear power plant tried to muster a discouraged opposition Sunday for a last attempt to block Laguna Verde from opening.

Representatives of about 80 groups

from all over Mexico scheduled a strategy session Sunday at the headquarters of a local cattlemen's group in this small town in Veracruz state only five miles from the controversial plant.

The cattlemen and the Mothers of Veracruz, a network of women's groups, form the backbone of the opposition to Laguna Verde, a pet government project for the past 20 years.

They had postponed the plant's opening by mobilizing considerable popular support. The opposition staged attentiongetting demonstrations, enlisted ecology groups nationwide in their cause and forced officials to listen to their con-

The first of the U.S.-designed plant's two reactors has been ready to operate since last year. But the government and the ruling Institutional Revolutionary Party, or PRI, moved cautiously in the face of national and local elections.

After the PRI hung on to the presidency by the smallest margin in party history in the July 6 elections, President Miguel de la Madrid said he was postponing start-up. The plant's foes were

But after local elections earlier this to conventional fuel.

PALMA SOLA, Mexico (AP) - Foes month left the PRI in firm control of Vemove ahead with the project. On Friday, it announced workers would start loading fuel next Saturday.

> After the loading, expected to take between 10 and 25 days, will come testing. Officials said the plant, which was announced 20 years ago and under construction since 1973, could be generating electricity within six months.

Privately, opposition leaders admit many people are discouraged. But they also say they aren't giving up yet. The day after the announcement, the

Mothers of Veracruz unit in Xalapa, capital of Veracruz, began a sit-in in front of the state government offices.

They also briefly blocked the highway leading to the plant. Group members said the government has army troops patrolling on the highway, the scene of several large anti-Laguna Verde demonstrations

in the past.

In Veracruz, a port city on the Gulf of Mexico, the mothers staged a protest march in front of city government of-

Laguna Verde's General Electric Co. boiling water reactors and its containment system are identical in design to the William H. Zimmer plant in Ohio. The troubled Zimmer project is the first nuclear plant ever slated for conversion


