

Seattle nips Oilers on Johnson's kick Radio

SEATTLE (AP)— Norm Johnson kicked a 46-yard field goal with one second left Sunday to give Seattle a 27-24 victory over the Houston Oilers and make quarterback Dave Krieg's return a winning one after a seven-game absence.

The Seahawks, 6-5, drove 53 yards in 10 plays in 4 minutes, 49 seconds before Johnson kicked his game-winning field goal.

Krieg, who was on injured reserve until late last week because of a separated right shoulder, threw a 23-yard touchdown pass to rookie Brian Blades in the first quarter.

The loss kept the Oilers, 7-4, from moving into a first-place tie with Cincinnati in the AFC Central. The Seahawks stayed in a tie for the lead

in the AFC West with the Los Angeles Raiders and Denver.

Seattle's game-winning field goal drive featured a 16-yard Krieg-to-Steve Largent pass to the Seattle 39.

Seattle tied the score 24-24 on John L. Williams' 44-yard touchdown run with 8:17 left, completing a 71-yard drive in six plays. Williams ran for 102 yards on 13 carries.

The Oilers went 89 yards in 10 plays for their third touchdown, with Warren Moon scoring on an 11-yard option keeper with 3:13 gone in the fourth quarter.

In the third quarter, Houston drove 73 yards in eight plays, with Allen Pinkett scoring on a 2-yard run at 5:32 of the period. The Seahawks came right back and went 66

yards, using 6½ minutes in running off 13 plays. Curt Warner scored on a 3-yard run at 12:12 of the third quarter.

In the first half, Moon and Drew Hill combined on a 57-yard scoring pass and Tony Zendejas kicked a 52-yard field goal for Houston, while Johnson kicked a 40-yard field goal for Seattle.

Houston missed out on two other scoring opportunities in the first half, which ended tied at 10.

Mike Rozier was stopped for a 1-yard loss by Ken Clarke on fourth-and-1 on the Seattle 6 with 1:30 left in the half.

In the second quarter, Houston moved to the Seattle 4-yard line after nose tackle Richard Byrd intercepted Moon at the Seahawks' 9. But Moon was intercepted by Paul Moyer in the end zone.

Houston drove 90 yards in nine plays on its first possession. Moon threw the 57-yard pass to Hill at 4:41 as Hill beat defensive back Vernon Dean by five yards.

Zendejas matched his career long with a 52-yard field goal 53 seconds into the second quarter, putting Houston ahead 10-7. Johnson retied the score with a 40-yard field goal that grazed the right upright at 8:26.
