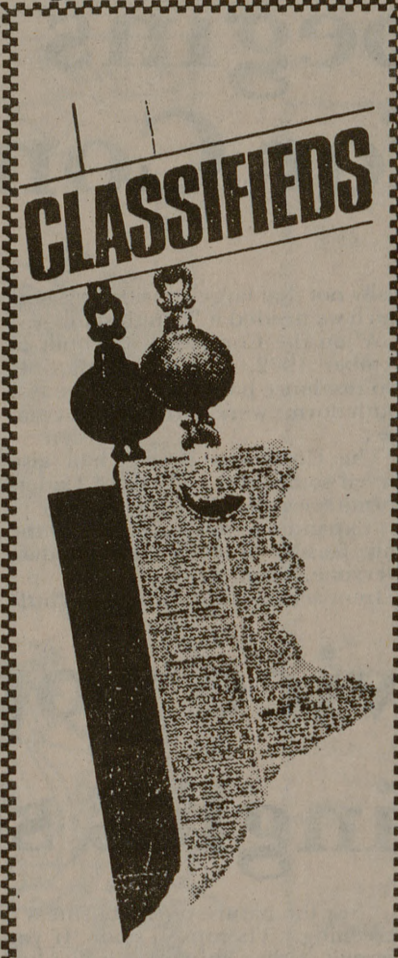

Shuttle bus hits University truck from behind

A Texas A&M shuttle bus hit a University truck from behind while driving north on Coke Street Tuesday.

Officer John Mann of the University Police Department said no serious injuries occurred in the accident.

However, one of the three bus passengers was given a routine check to look for minor neck injuries, he said.

UPD officials are compiling evidence to determine which driver was at fault in the accident, Mann said Tuesday.

Three of the bus' headlights were broken in the accident. Damage to the truck resulted in its rear bumper being bent.

Doug Williams, manager of bus operations, said the bus driver will be suspended from driving for one day if the accident is chargeable. Her driving record also will be reviewed, he said.
